1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Paul Zagami called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. and the attendees in the room introduced themselves.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The summary from the February 26, 2024 meeting was approved with no corrections.

4. FORWARD PINELLAS ACTIONS & SPOTLIGHT

Chelsea Favero, Forward Pinellas staff, reviewed the March 13, 2024, Forward Pinellas Board summary. The Board approved five amendments to the Countywide Plan. The Board approved the transmittal of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to state and federal review agencies. The Board also received an update on the Housing Action Plan – The Needs of the Senior Population and the Challenges they Face with Affordable Housing. The Directors Report covered legislative updates, updates to the Regional MPO merger and updates on the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP).

Regarding the SPOTLight Emphasis areas, the BPAC will receive an overview of projects north of Nebraska Avenue on US 19, looking at interchanges versus viaduct concepts in the coming months. Staff is continuing to work with PSTA on advancing Waterborne Transportation.

5. ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Katherine Tellez and Tory Gibler with Fehr & Peers, a Forward Pinellas consultant, shared a presentation on an update to the Forward Pinellas Active Transportation Plan (ATP). The ATP outlines the active transportation projects Forward Pinellas plans to fund over the next 20 years with flexible funding sources. Ms. Gibler shared updates since the February meeting. Comments made at the February meeting have been incorporated into the updates. In comparing the Existing Conditions (Memo I) from the 2020 ATP to the 2024 ATP, existing bicycle and pedestrian conditions were updated, latest statistics were incorporated, regarding benefits of active transportation, and the Equity Emphasis Areas were incorporated into the revised plan. Regarding Best Practices (Memo II) in the 2024 ATP, all content and policies were refreshed, standards or guidelines released since 2020 included Public Right of Way

Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG) and Manual Uniformed Traffic Control Device (MUTCD). Bicycle & Pedestrian Safety Analysis (MEMO III), the crash trends, collision types, unsafe locations, and countermeasures with results from the Safe Streets Pinellas Action Plan were updated. The top unsafe segments and intersections were retained, while adding the highinjury network developed in the Safe Streets Pinellas Action Plan. Facility Types (MEMO IV), all previous facility descriptions based on the latest best practices and standards were updated as were bicycle and pedestrian treatments, such as directional curb ramps, adequate nighttime lighting levels and lane repurposing. Analysis (MEMO V), bicycle level of stress was updated. New analyses conducted were pedestrian level of comfort, bicycle accessibility, pedestrian accessibility and stress/comfort compared to bicycle and pedestrian access. The latest equity analysis and the Equity Emphasis Areas were incorporated. Project Concept Summaries (MEMO VI) Top ten priority projects were retained and estimated planning costs to adjust for inflation was updated. The 2024 ATP update also included minor edits to performance measures and included pilot project summary from two demonstration projects conducted since the 2020 ATP release. Next steps include receiving feedback from the BPAC and incorporating it into the memos, preparing materials to present to the Forward Pinellas Board in April and incorporation of the ATP into the 2050 LRTP. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

6. DRAFT TRANSPORTATION PRIORITIES

Chelsea Favero, Forward Pinellas staff, shared information on the draft transportation priorities. Forward Pinellas adopts project priority lists for its Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on an annual basis. These lists are used for the allocation of state and federal funding. These lists include Multimodal Transportation Priority and Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Projects. The approved priority lists are used by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) in the development of its Five-Year Work Program. The Multimodal Priority List was reviewed. Since its last update, five projects were allocated funding implementation and are being moved from the "unfunded" section. Projects shaded in gray on the tables indicate a change to the status or detail of the project has been made. The Transportation Alternatives list was reviewed. Since the last update to this list in 2023, three projects were allocated full funding and were moved from the 'unfunded' portion of the list to the 'programmed' portion. Staff is not proposing to add any new projects to the list at this time. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

7. BICYCLE PARKING CODE COMPARISON

Alexis Hall, Forward Pinellas Intern, shared a presentation on Bike Parking Code Comparison. Functional, secure, and adequate bicycle parking is a key provision to ensure that bicycling is a real transportation option for residents, employees, and visitors. Research conducted explored methods that could be adopted to reduce required automobile parking and encourage bicycle use by providing both long-term and short-term bicycle parking. Comparisons between St. Petersburg, FL, Charlotte, NC, Kansas City, MO, Minneapolis, MN and Seattle, WA were shared as well as spacing guidelines. The use of micromobility is on the rise and many cities are incorporating e-bike charging stations in public parks. Smart electric bike charging stations offer an ideal solution to enhance sustainability. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

8. BPAC BUSINESS

A. Friends of the Pinellas Trail

Scott Daniels shared the Volunteers Appreciation Picnic was held on March 16, 2024,

in conjunction with their annual meeting, in John Taylor Park in Largo. Elections were held for board officers and Dr. Jan Hirschfield was elected as the President. He will be attending future BPAC meetings as the representative for Friends of the Pinellas Trail. Stuart Schwartzreich shared there are over 11,000 members to the Friends Facebook page. Dr. Hirschfield also mentioned an increase in family members donating benches along the Trail in remembrance of family members that have passed. Friends will be supporting Targeted Enforcement Day with representatives in St. Petersburg as well as Dunedin.

B. Bike Your City 2024

Bike Your City was held on March 2, 2023 in St. Peterburg. The ride began in Childs Park at 9:30 am, in collaboration with Center for Urban Transportation Research (CUTR) at USF Tampa, St. Petersburg Police Department, FDOT, and Pinellas County Public Works. It was an 8 1/2-mile route with over 150 riders. At the end of the ride Ben & Jerrys Ice Cream was served.

C. Pinellas Trail Targeted Enforcement Day

The Pinellas Trail Security Task Force (PTSTF) has moved their Targeted Enforcement Day to Saturday, April 6, 2024.

9. AGENCY REPORTS

Pinellas Trail Loop/Duke Energy Trail (North & South Gaps)

Joan Rice reported construction has begun at the Trail overpass, over the Lake Tarpon Outfall Canal. Construction is expected to be completed by Fall of 2025.

Clearwater Bicycle Pedestrian Program

Ric Hartman shared the overpass is almost complete at US 19 and Northside Drive. According to FDOT, the overpass should be open by the Fall 2024.

• St. Petersburg Bicycle Pedestrian Program

Alaina Grundy shared St. Petersburg City staff who participated in the Bike Your City really enjoyed the event. A Better Bike Share Living Laps Grant was submitted toward helping integrate micro mobility equity programs with the transportation disadvantaged programs for PSTA. The City is expecting to hear back at the end of April if the grant is awarded. St. Petersburg is also working on refining their Safe Streets For All approach for the upcoming grant cycle.

Largo Bicycle Pedestrian Program

Whitney Clark shared in March of 2023, the City of Largo was awarded a Complete Streets grant to improve pedestrian safety in downtown Largo, on the stretch of Clearwater/Largo Road between West Bay Drive and 8th Avenue SW. A few weeks ago, City staff joined Forward Pinellas, Pinellas County and Kimley-Horne to survey the existing conditions of sidewalk and overall pedestrian environment. The project team was able to identify a range of potential improvements to protect pedestrians.

• Oldsmar Bicycle Pedestrian Program

No one in attendance.

Pinellas Park Bicycle Pedestrian Program

Tiffany Menard shared the 118th Ave trails project is in design. This is a Transportation Alternative (TA) project from 2019. A community open house was held a few weeks ago with

great attendance. The 60th Street implementation plan is a little over halfway done and alternatives will be presented at a future workshop.

• Dunedin Bicycle Pedestrian Program

Kathy Gademer shared staff will be present at Skinner Blvd. for Targeted Enforcement Day on April 6th.

• Tarpon Springs Bicycle Pedestrian Program

Caroline Lanford was not in attendance.

Pinellas County Schools (PCS)

Joe Camera shared there were no updates.

FDOT District 7 Updates

Jensen Hackett, FDOT, shared no specific updates, but lots of construction projects are going on across Pinellas County. Resurfacing projects still in the construction phase are adding bicycle and pedestrian enhancements.

10. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Membership

There are seven openings on the BPAC. Two for Pinellas Park, one for Largo and four for At Large. Alan Schrader is attending today's meeting in hopes of filling the open Largo seat. Tech representatives Ric Hartman from the City of Clearwater, Elaina Grundy from the City of St. Petersburg and Jeffery Blakey from the City of Largo were welcomed.

B. Correspondence, Publications, Articles of Interest

Chair Zagami reminded members we are still in Spring Break with tourists.

Gordon Brown made a suggestion to find ways to hold onto history regarding future projects that have already been through the process of Open Houses and residential input, and the results of this outreach and make it available to the public, in order to defend past decisions, prior to construction of the project.

Peter Wray shared that Treasure Island held a disastrous public meeting for road improvements due to someone's misinterpretation of designs and plans that were posted on the Neighborhood app.

Daniel Alejandro gave positive comments to the Bike Your City event, however, during the event, many riders did not adhere to the "stay right" law, taking up the entire Trail and blocking on coming riders.

5. Sunshine Law Overview

SUMMARY

Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law, s. 286.011, F.S., commonly referred to as the Sunshine Law, provides a right of access to governmental proceedings of public boards or commissions at both the state and local levels. The law is equally applicable to elected and appointed boards and applies to any gathering of two or more members of the same board to discuss some matter which will foreseeably come before that board for action. Members-elect to such boards or commissions are also subject to the Sunshine Law, even though they have not yet taken office.

Maria White, Assistance County Attorney, will provide an overview of BPAC members responsibilities under the Sunshine Law and give guidance on how to remain in compliance with the law.

6. Future Plans for US 19

SUMMARY

As the US 19 corridor has transformed with the construction of grade-separated interchanges in recent decades, the mobility and land use impacts of these interchanges have been monitored closely. While travel times for vehicles traveling mainline US 19 have decreased with the implementation of interchanges, bicycle, pedestrian and transit rider access has decreased. In addition, there has been a shift in the land use patterns along the corridor, with businesses that depend on access and visibility to passing motorists being replaced by multifamily housing. Given those impacts, Forward Pinellas has been working with the Florida Department of Transportation to determine if the construction of interchanges north of Nebraska Avenue to the Pasco County line is the preferred improvement for the US 19 corridor.

A representative from FDOT will provide the committee with an overview of the different types of projects that could be considered for the corridor, along with an outline of the process for selecting a preferred alternative.














February Totals by Counter Location*






Automated Trail Counter Data Collection Period: February 2017 – February 2024 Data



February Monthly Trail Counts 2017 - 2024








