# FORWARD PINELLAS LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE MEETING SUMMARY NOVEMBER 14, 2018

The Forward Pinellas Legislative Committee met in the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Conference Room.

## 1. CALL TO ORDER

Vice Mayor Caudell called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m. and those present introduced themselves.

Whit Blanton explained that the Florida Legislature is holding an upcoming organizational session and committee assignments should be forthcoming. Staff will monitor the assignments and schedule appointments with the delegation members as appropriate. Staff is also still coordinating with local partners to align priorities and requests where possible.

#### 2. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE FLORIDA RIGHT TO FARM ACT

Sarah Caper introduced this item offering a brief synopsis of activities that lead to this point. Robyn Keefe and Attorney Michael Dema, from the City of St. Petersburg, updated the committee on the work done to date in collaboration with Forward Pinellas staff. The City is proposing amendments to the Act to facilitate local urban agriculture opportunities. They discussed the current barriers and the proposed amendments to the language in the Florida Right to Farm Act to address those barriers. The committee members discussed the possibility of potential push back and ultimately concluded there would likely be limited opposition. It was decided that the Forward

Pinellas and City of St. Petersburg attorneys would work together to craft suggested language. Linking to the USDA criteria for food deserts was discussed.

#### 3. OTHER ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

Whit Blanton advised preliminary conversations have begun with members of the Pinellas Legislative Delegation regarding some of the potential priorities currently being followed and tracked by staff. Specifically, the indexing of the local fuel tax to inflation and enhancing the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) to allow flexibility for transit and parallel corridors.

After query by Whit Blanton about vacation rentals, Mayor Kennedy stated she would ultimately like to see the law rescinded. However, she agreed it was advisable to have draft language ready to be responsive to the direction taken by the legislators on the topic. Brian Lowack suggested a coordinated effort with other local governments to work towards one point that the collective group can rally behind, rather than just attempting to repeal the preemption. Mayor Kennedy will bring suggested language back to the committee for consideration and Forward Pinellas staff was directed to develop a one-page document on this item. Brian Lowack will follow the activities relating to this item and report back to the committee.

Whit Blanton reminded the group that there would not be a meeting in December. He stated he would email the group if any bills are filed related areas of interest currently being discussed by this committee prior to the next meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 12:50 p.m.

#### 3. State bills of interest



#### **SUMMARY**

Several bills of interest have already been filed:

- SB 68: Transportation Disadvantaged (Book). Adding language stating that Community Transportation Coordinators (CTCs) shall plan for and use regional fare payment systems, if available and cost effective.
- SB 70: State Funds (Passidomo). Exempting the State Housing Trust Fund and Local Government Housing Trust Fund from a provision authorizing the Legislature to transfer unappropriated cash balances to the Budget Stabilization Fund and the General Revenue Fund.
- SR 76: Use of Wireless Communications Devices While Driving (Simpson). Creating a
  ban on wireless communication devices while driving, prohibiting a person from operating a
  motor vehicle while listening or talking on a wireless communications device for the purpose
  of voice interpersonal communication.
- SB 78: Public Financing of Construction Projects (Rodriguez). Prohibiting state-financed constructors from commencing construction of certain structures in coastal areas without first conducting a sea level impact projection study that must be approved and published.
- SR 82: Vegetable Gardens (Bradley). Prohibiting local governments from regulating vegetable gardens on residential properties.
- HB 45: Use of Wireless Communications Devices While Driving (Slosberg). Prohibits operation of motor vehicles while holding or touching wireless communications device.
- HB 107: Use of Wireless Communications Devices While Driving (Toldeo with Grieco, Massullo, McClure, Stevenson). Prohibits person from operating motor vehicle while using wireless communications device for purpose of nonvoice or voice interpersonal communication.
- **HB 145: Vegetable Gardens (Fetterhoff).** Prohibits local governments from regulating vegetable gardens on residential properties except as otherwise provided by law.
