#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Bill Dudley, Pinellas County School Board, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and asked attendees to introduce themselves.

#### 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Doug Mullis motioned approval of the summary of the June 5, 2019 meeting, seconded by Commissioner Carroll and the vote passed unanimously.

#### 3. HAZARDOUS WALKING CONDITIONS REVIEW

Mr. Al Bartolotta, Forward Pinellas Division Manager, addressed the committee to share information on Hazardous Walking Conditions which is a standing informational item on the agenda. Florida Administration Code (F.A.C.), Rule 6A-3.0171, requires local school districts to assure that county and city officials are advised of hazards involving students walking to and from school. Pinellas County has a two-mile rule, in that those students living within a two-mile radius of the public school they attend are required to walk, bike or seek other transportation to school. Through its hazardous walk review team, Pinellas School District staff surveys and inspects the surrounding areas of the county's public schools and produces an annual report on walking conditions. This information is shared with Pinellas County and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and these agencies work with the School District to address any issues affecting the safety of students walking to and from school. If a hazardous condition is identified on a school route, the affected student(s) is scheduled for bus service. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

#### 4. PINELLAS COUNTY SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Ms. Donna Sicilian, Executive Director for Student Services with Pinellas County Public Schools (PCPS), addressed the committee on the Mental Health and Wellness in the Pinellas County Schools Plan for 2019-2020. Ms. Sicilian shared information on the plan and the type of services being offered to students and families. The Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act includes the provision of mental health services to students who are identified as having the potential to harm themselves or others. Senate Bill 7030 stipulated that school districts need to develop a "standardized, statewide behavioral threat assessment instrument for use by all public schools, including charter schools, which addresses early identification, evaluation, early intervention, and student support" by August 1, 2019. According to the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), nearly 50 percent of adolescents ages 13 to 18 have a mental disorder. The NIMH also reports that 32 percent of young people in this age group are afflicted with an anxiety disorder and that 2.3 million of them experienced a major depressive episode in 2017. Pinellas County Schools has been proactive on the issue of mental health, having already employed a threat assessment team in the schools and at the district prior to the enaction of the Public Safety Act. In addition. Pinellas County Schools has developed a health and wellness plan that addresses the expansion of mental health awareness and violence prevention efforts, access to student services staff, the strengthening of community partnerships and the refinement of threat assessment procedures. So that students continue to have access to mental health professionals, additional licensed clinical social workers and school psychologists were hired with funding from a grant provided through Mental Health Allocation funding. The School Prevention Office is responsible for promoting "a safe learning environment and highest student achievement by providing prevention resources and services." Discussion ensued where questions were taken and appropriately answered.

#### 5. TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION SAFETY CONCERNS

Ms. Stephanie Carrier, Pinellas County Public Schools Transportation, shared with the committee information regarding travel safety concerns expressed by parents for students traveling to and from school. Parents are directed to a transportation call center and an on-line link to complete and submit a Travel to School Safety Concern form. School Transportation staff works closely with the School Transportation and Enhanced Pedestrian Safety (STEPS) Committee to address these comments and concerns. STEPS will reach out to the responsible jurisdiction to make them aware of the safety concern and continue follow-up until the issue is resolved. Discussion followed with questions taken and appropriately answered.

#### 6. SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

At the last STSC meeting, it was suggested that additional public outreach is needed that alerts people about when to stop for school busses and the consequences for violating the rule. Ms. Hilary

Lehman, Forward Pinellas Communications and Outreach Program Manager, discussed the results of a meeting held with Pinellas County, Forward Pinellas and school board staff regarding public outreach strategies including signage for the public to alert them about when to stop for school busses. Several dynamic signs were provided at the beginning of the school year reminding drivers to stop for school buses. Public Service Announcement (PSA) options were discussed with the school board and FDOT in hopes of securing funds for better placement of ads, but FDOT has stated that Federal Safety Funding is not available for education by legal statute. However, discussions have continued with the district on the possibly of state funding for PSAs, which is still pending. Some good news is that one of the most dangerous school bus stops, on Gandy Boulevard, was relocated for the safety of students. Currently, the school bus camera recordings are only used if needed by law enforcement for accidents and for monitoring purposes. Mr. Herbic noted that there has not been support in the state legislature to be able to utilize the video from the buses to charge motorists who violate the law. Ms. Casey Morse, Pinellas County Public Works Traffic, shared information regarding the design of new school bus stop signs that use pictures instead of text. Discussion followed with questions taken and appropriately answered.

#### 7. OTHER BUSINESS

#### A. Pinellas SPOTlight Emphasis Areas Update

Mr. Bartolotta updated the committee on the SPOTlight Emphasis areas. With regards to US19, FDOT has kicked off a study assessing the design of the frontage roads from Gulf to Bay Boulevard to SR 580 to make them safer for pedestrians and bicycles. Regarding Enhancing Beach Access, staff is currently working with the City of Indian Rocks Beach on a vision plan for the city for Gulf Boulevard and adjacent land uses.

#### F. Comments

A suggestion was made about sending a letter thanking Chuck Henson for his segments on Traffic Safety and School Safety.

Commissioner Eggers stepped out of the meeting for a moment to reach out to a legislative representative on the question of the enforceability of video evidence from the bus cameras. He reported that state statue does not preclude sending warning letters out to violators. Commissioner Eggers and Mr. Herbic agreed to meet to discuss ways to address the issue of permitting bus camera data to be used to pursue motorists violating the law.

#### **SUMMARY**

Forward Pinellas provides an annual snapshot of the transportation, land use and socioeconomic conditions in Pinellas County through its annual Countywide Trends and Conditions Report. The most recent report was released in November 2019. It presents information on socioeconomic and land use trends, roadway and transit performance, crash analysis, commuting patterns, waterborne transportation services, intelligent transportation system (ITS) technologies, and bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. #### 4. Safe Streets Pinellas



#### **SUMMARY**

Between 2013 and 2017, Pinellas County averaged 38 pedestrian deaths per year. This was more than twice the national average. Although fewer in number, bicycle fatalities were twice the national average over the same time period. There were also 90 fatalities, involving motorists as well as vulnerable road users, in Pinellas County last year. These figures underscore the need for a paradigm shift in the way transportation safety is addressed in Pinellas County, one that focuses on the problem as a public health issue rather than an inevitable side effect of a modern transportation system. This is the underlying concept of the vision zero movement that took root in Sweden in the 1990s and has since spread to Europe and many American cities. It seeks to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries, while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for everyone.

A local vision zero initiative, "Safe Streets Pinellas," was launched earlier this year by Forward Pinellas to develop targeted strategies based on the collaborative input of citizens, community leaders and public agencies aimed at making Pinellas County a safer place to travel. To initiate this community-wide collaboration, Forward Pinellas is hosting the Safe Streets Pinellas Summit on March 31, 1 -3 pm, at the St. Petersburg College EpiCenter, 13805-58<sup>th</sup> Street North. This event will provide an opportunity for those in attendance to share their ideas for how to make Pinellas County streets safer for everyone. The summit will also feature guest speakers, including FDOT District 7 Secretary David Gwynn.

Forward Pinellas staff will present the committee with more information about Safe Streets Pinellas and the upcoming summit.

Students residing within two miles of their assigned schools are required to walk there unless a hazardous condition on their route is identified. In such cases the affected students must be bused to school.

No one has submitted one yet and currently there is not a representative for the City of Dunedin to replace Joan Rice.
- c) A request was made to have someone revisit Seminole ES for the timing on the cross walk at Park Blvd. It needs to be readjusted as it was adjusted for the opposite direction. This request is in conjunction with a previous TTSS form.
- d) School Zone Update City of St. Petersburg: Nick Head was onsite to expound on the general outline of all school zones. DOT speed zone manual was issued for compliance containing information on how they issue zones across the state and county. The construction crew was very flexible throughout the project. A map was distributed that showed areas of the students' homes in a grid and the path they should take to and from school. This map solved and simplified the process.
- b. **Kings Highway, Sandy Lane and Hunsinger** Construction on sidewalks, no walk way for children, no detour. No one at PCS was notified. They are required to provide a sidewalk, they didn't. Runkles is doing counts now. Last year there was over 300 students passing each week.
- c. **Clearwater High School, Plumb Elementary** East side of Hercules, construction will basically shut down that area and the ability to cross. 18-20 students a day. Runkles staffs there currently and has walked the area and does not see a way to get the kids out and down where they need to go. **Clearwater HS** Druid Road access to the junior parking lot is switching from the Hercules approach to the Arcturas approach.
- d. **Bauder, Jacobson and Seminole Middle** Beginning Spring 2020: Road work done in easements will affect. They are widening the road, adding a 10-foot-wide sidewalk on Bauder side, extending the turn lane and adding a wide sidewalk in front of Seminole Middle.
  - \*\*Information regarding upcoming construction projects should be communicated between the school district and the municipalities on a more frequent basis.

#### IV. <u>NEW GENERAL BUSINES</u>

- a) New PCS transportation representatives Cammie Weeks and Stephine Carrier will no longer be attending our meetings. Joe Camera and Autumn Westermann will be their replacement. They will also be doing Hazardous reviews and bus stop related issues.
- b) Review of current TTSS spreadsheet Current TTSS have been getting documented and resolved very quickly.
- c) Nina Harris Exceptional The issue is a request by the principal for flashing lights or signs in front of school in the chance that a student runs into the street. This is outside of the school and has been forwarded to Pinellas Park PD
- **d) Sunset Drive, TSMS** Open requester is asking for a crossing guard or staff to man the drive. Casey will look into this and see if it has already been closed.

- e) Marshal and 1st Crossing Guard New crossing guard will begin on Feb 18, 2020. Susan will email and notify the people that submitted the TTSS.
- **f) Gulf Beaches:** May 2020 Inside lanes will be open. Buses will be able to travel. Parent pickups will be an issue. Joe Camera will investigate this.

#### V. COMMITTEE BUSINESS/UPDATES

- a) Congratulations Pinellas Park Crossing Guard Program of the Year! Great Job!!
- **b)** Crossing Guard Spreadsheet The spreadsheet was updated, and Sandra Knoebel also has the crossing guards and school as a Shape file.
- c) Chairman Voting Casey Morse was unanimously voted back in as Chairperson of the STEPS program. Next vote will be in August 2020.

#### VI. OLD GENERAL BUSINESS

- a. Old TTSS We went through previous spreadsheets of 'open' TTSS. Several concerns were closed. Casey Morse and Joe Camera will be following up with a few concerns. If a concern was still open and the municipalities wasn't represented during our meeting, we left it open to look at on a later date.
- **b.** Summer Bridge sites Marshal Touchton will get us these sites for our next meeting.
- **c. Crash Data Information:** Sandra Knoebel presented us with the traffic fatality information. 4 fatal crashes in January. 8 fatal crashes since the new year. In the end of March, Knoebel will have 2019 map. Serious injuries will be added to her reports.
