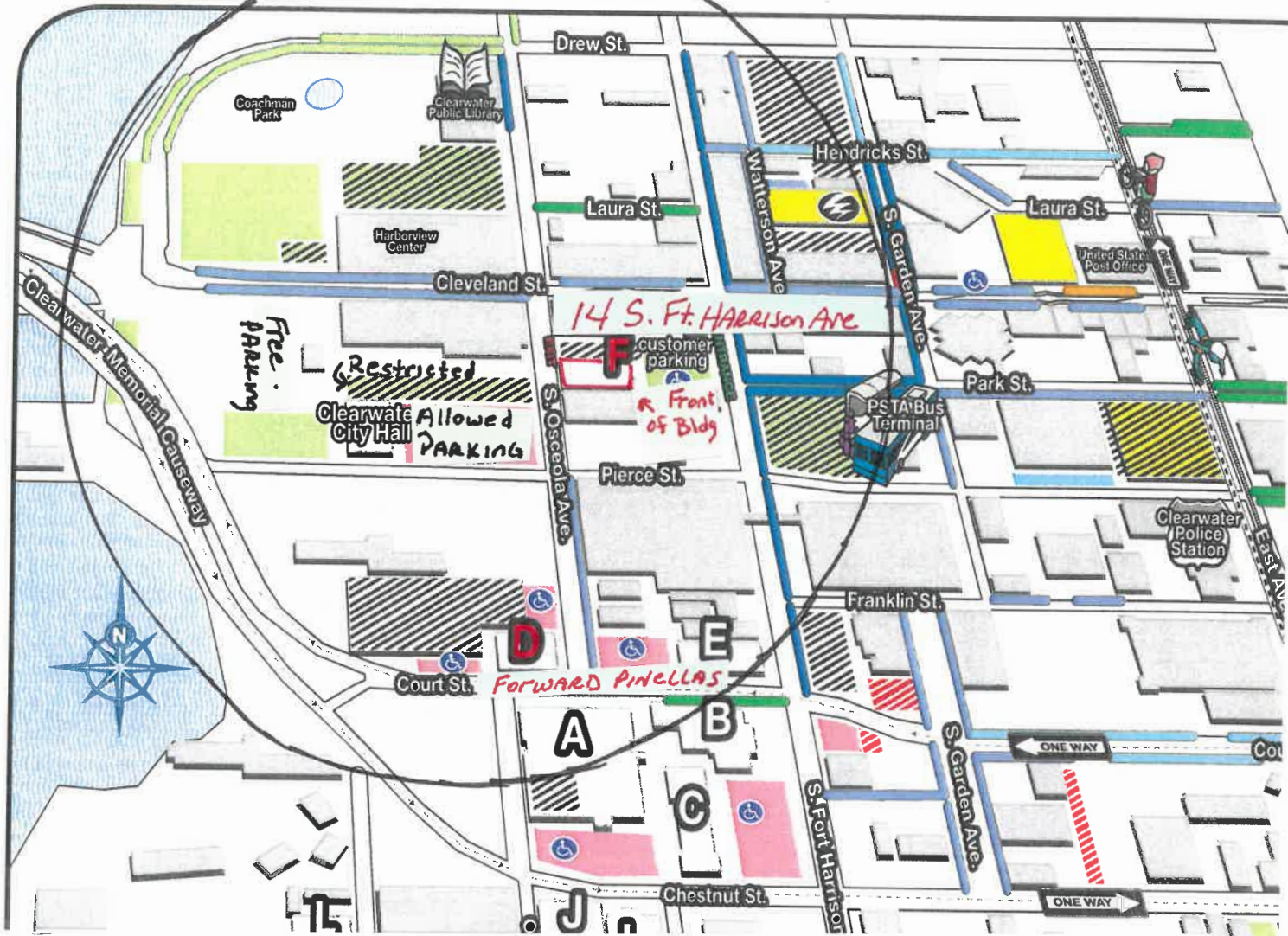

1. CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE TO FLAG/INTRODUCTIONS

Robert Feigel, Forward Pinellas staff, reviewed the Zoom meeting guidelines and the attendees were announced by Maria Kelly, there were 28 attendees. Chair Karen Mullins called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Chair Mullins welcomed guests at this time.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Bill Jonson made a motion to approve the minutes. It was seconded by Bob Henion. The minutes were approved with one correction, under Forward Pinellas Actions. The second sentence should read “The Board discussed a couple of controversial cases ‘which’ took up a large portion of the meeting.”

3. FORWARD PINELLAS ACTIONS

Al Bartolotta, Forward Pinellas Planning Manager, reviewed the highlights of the Forward Pinellas Board meeting for October 14, 2020. The Board did not take any actions except for the land use case items. The agenda was mostly updates and reports. Mr. Whit Blanton, Forward Pinellas Executive Director, added that the Forward Pinellas agenda was kept light due to the possibility of a contentious land use case in St. Petersburg. As it turned out, the case was challenged prior to the meeting and removed from the agenda until further notice. The Board was updated on the Countywide Housing Strategy webinar series, the Waterboard Transportation committee and priority projects for funding.

4. FY 2019/20 – FY 2023/24 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Jensen Hackett, Florida Department of Transportation District 7 (FDOT), presented a proposed Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) amendment. This amendment is for the addition of wrong-way driver vehicle detection system (WWVDS) equipment on exit ramps in various locations along I-175, I-275, and I-375. This is a new project with a cost of \$1,141,400. This project will not affect any current projects in the FY 2020/21-2024/25 TIP. Questions were taken and appropriately answered. Dylan Carlson made a motion recommending the Forward Pinellas Board approve the TIP. This was seconded by Steve Graber and passed with a unanimous vote.

5. FALL UPDATE OF THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Jared Austin, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a presentation with the committee on the Forward Pinellas fall update of the FY 2020/21 – 2024/25 TIP. The purpose of the fall update is to incorporate the transportation work programs of the local governments into the TIP. This update incorporates the transportation section of the FY 2020 – FY 2026 Pinellas County Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Formal adoption of the TIP is required by July 1 of each year in order for the county to receive state and federal funding for transportation projects. This adoption most recently occurred in the summer of 2020. In addition to local government municipal work programs, the fall update of the TIP incorporates the most recent PSTA work program and grants. The local work programs include projects from the various local airports and the Port of St. Petersburg. Members can find an interactive TIP map on the forwardpinellas.org website, under “Building Your Future/Transportation Improvements,” where they can look up information about the various projects. Ms. Nancy McKibben, Pinellas County Public Works Transportation, shared a presentation on the Pinellas County Capital Improvements Program, reviewing various projects throughout the county. Ms. McKibben reviewed new transportation projects added to the CIP. These

included roadway, ATMS/ITS and bicycle and pedestrian projects. The roadway projects included 1) East Lake Road Preliminary Engineering Study, from Tampa Road to Trinity Boulevard; 2) Sunset Point Road, Preliminary Engineering Study, from Highland Avenue to Keene Road; and 3) West Bay Drive, a multimodal project, from Belleair Bridge to Clearwater-Largo Road. The ATMS/ITS projects included 1) Alderman Road from Alternate US 19 to US 19; 2) Drew Street from Alternate US 19 to McMullen Booth Road; and 3) 113th Street from Tom Stuart Causeway to Ulmerton Road. All three of these projects are in the design phase. Sidewalks/Shared Use Path projects included 1) Virginia Avenue from CR 1 to Hercules Avenue; 2) Pinellas Trail Loop (Duke Energy) South Gap Preliminary Engineering Study, from Haines Bayshore to 126th Avenue; 3) Starkey Road, which is currently under design, from Ulmerton Road to East Bay Drive; and 4) 71st Street North sidewalk improvements, from 54th Avenue North to 38th Avenue North. Questions were taken and appropriately answered. Axl David made a motion to recommend approval to the Forward Pinellas Board. This was seconded by Tracey Schofield and passed with a unanimous vote.

6. DRAFT OF THE TRENDS AND CONDITIONS REPORT

Mr. Robert Feigel, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a Powerpoint presentation with the committee regarding the update to Countywide Trends and Conditions Report. The Trends and Conditions Report provides an annual snapshot of the county's transportation system, including roads, trails, sidewalks, bike lanes, and transit services. In addition, the report provides data on economic and land use activity, waterborne transportation and emerging technologies. The report serves as a tool to evaluate progress toward achieving the objectives of the Long-Range Transportation Plan, identify improvements to address safety concerns and congestion problems, inform transportation safety studies and transportation project design, and target law enforcement activities related to safety. Questions were taken and appropriately answered. Paul Wallace made a motion to recommend approval to the Forward Pinellas Board. This was seconded by Tracey Schofield and passed with a unanimous vote.

7. FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SAFETRIP

Ms. Margaret Kubilins, Florida Department of Transportation District 7 (FDOT), shared a Powerpoint presentation with the committee regarding FDOT's SafeTRIP initiative. SafeTRIP is a comprehensive strategy that will address Traffic Management, Regional Demand, Innovation and Smart Work Zones, and Public Engagement (TRIP) associated with the scheduled improvement of the I-275/Westshore Boulevard interchange in Tampa. SafeTrip is a comprehensive approach to ensure safety and mobility during the reconstruction of this interchange. FDOT's vision for SafeTRIP is a well-planned and innovative construction zone environment that maintains safety and reliability for the local community, traveling public and construction workers by providing quality transportation choices, strategic innovation and proactive communication. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

8. FLORIDA TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Jensen Hackett, Florida Department of Transportation District 7 (FDOT), presented the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP) to the committee. The FTP is a statewide long-range transportation plan for all of Florida and defines the state's future transportation vision and identifies goals, objectives and strategies to accomplish that vision. The plan also provides

a framework for transportation decisions and investments. Plan implementation will be in effect in December 2020 or early next year. FDOT has a webpage for the public to post feedback on their thoughts on regional and local trends. The Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) and the Vision Zero initiative both seek to work toward a fatality-free roadway system. The FTP Virtual Room, which was launched on October 5, 2020, allows viewers to walk through the seven goal stations to provide input on the draft strategies and share ideas for reaching the goal. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

9. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Pinellas SPOTlight Emphasis Areas Update

There was no update provided at this time.

B. TBARTA Update

Bill Jonson shared that the TBARTA CAC met on October 15th, 2020 There were two major presentations shared. One was regarding the Regional Rapid Transit Project dealing with the station site opportunities and the other was a presentation on MOOVIT, which is an application developed by Intel, sharing multi-jurisdictional transit mapping.

THE PLANNING COUNCIL AND METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR PINELLAS COUNTY

The Forward Pinellas Board held this public meeting in person on November 10, 2020 at 1 p.m. in the Magnolia Room at the Pinellas County Cooperative Extension. Presenters and members of the public also had the opportunity to participate virtually to ensure public safety in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The board adopted the Gateway/Mid-County Area Master Plan Memorandum of Understanding

After three years of extensive community outreach and collaborative effort between four local governments, the [Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority](#), the [Florida Department of Transportation \(FDOT\)](#), and [Forward Pinellas](#), all local governments have adopted a Memorandum of Understanding that shows a commitment to implement the plan by meeting regularly and exchanging information, considering the [Gateway Master Plan](#) when revising plans, land development regulations or developing capital improvement programs, and working cooperatively with the private sector and other public partners in realizing the vision for the Gateway. The Forward Pinellas Board has now adopted the Memorandum of Understanding as well.

The board unanimously approved an amendment to the FY 2020/21-FY2024/25 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) proposed an amendment to the FY 2020/21 – 2024/25 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the addition of wrong-way driver vehicle detection equipment on exit ramps at various locations along I-175, I-275, and I-375.
- St. Petersburg Councilmember Gabbard applauded the effort, noting that she remembered a man who lost his life because he went the wrong way down one of those roads. She was thankful we are addressing this issue.

Forward Pinellas staff presented an update to the FY 2020/21-FY2024/25 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- Each fall, Forward Pinellas updates its Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to incorporate any changes or additions made to the Capital Improvement Programs (CIP) of local partners at the beginning of the new fiscal year on October 1.
- As the local government with the largest transportation budget, Pinellas County staff presented specific updates to the County CIP that have been incorporated into the Forward Pinellas fall TIP update. Some of these projects in various phases include:
 - Roadway Projects
 - East Lake Rd.
 - Lakeshore Estates
 - Nebraska Ave.

- Intersection Improvements
 - Belcher Rd. at SR 60/Gulf-to-Bay Blvd.
 - Lakeview Rd. and Keene Rd. Drainage Improvement

The board approved the Scope of Work for an Equity Assessment

Forward Pinellas is conducting an equity assessment of its agency operations and planning activities. Staff has developed a scope of work that outlines the necessary steps to develop a strong connection with the community that will ensure our work county-wide is inclusive and equitable for all people in all communities in Pinellas County. The board approved the scope of work, which Forward Pinellas will complete over the next year using its in-house staff. Councilmember Rice offered guidance to further define the word “equity,” recognizing that people have different needs and “equity” doesn’t mean everyone gets the same, but rather that people get what they need.

The board unanimously approved the legislative earmarks and transit funding position statement based on the Legislative Committee recommendation

The board approved the draft Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area (TMA) Leadership Group position statement on legislative earmarks and transit funding, with a call for expanded flexibility of the state’s Transportation Trust Fund within large urbanized areas.

The board will act on legislative policy priorities at its next meeting in January 2021.

The board accepted the Countywide Trends and Conditions Report

Forward Pinellas’ *Countywide Trends and Conditions Report* provides an annual snapshot of the county’s transportation system, including roads, trails, sidewalks, bike lanes, and transit services. In 2019, 62% of all traffic fatalities involved pedestrians, bicyclists or motorcyclists. This year, we saw a 35% increase of residents working from home since last year as well as more than 100% increase in trail users in May and June. The board recommended approval of two amendments to the Countywide Plan Map

- The board recommended approval of two amendments:
 - An amendment from the City of Tarpon Springs to amend properties at 685 and 687 East Klosterman Rd. from Residential Low Medium to Preservation to preserve wetlands on a portion of the property. (Unanimously)
 - An amendment from the City of St. Petersburg to amend a property at 1525 29th St. North from Residential Medium to Multimodal Corridor to develop a multifamily triplex.(11-1)
 - A neighboring property owner expressed concerned that the potential uses allowed under the proposed land use designation were so broad that many things could be allowed next to his home.
 - St. Petersburg staff clarified that any uses that would need a special exception, specifically a parking lot, would go through a regulatory review process beforehand. In addition, the property had code violations and a derelict home; however, the violations have come into compliance and the home has been demolished. Also, no site plan is required at this stage in this process.
 - Councilmember Rice expressed that she is in favor of redevelopment along appropriate corridors; however, she would like to ensure the developer respects the concerns of the neighborhood.
 - Chairman Eggers noted that this amendment would provide transition between commercial/mixed use corridors and single family neighborhoods with the “missing middle” housing concept.

The board unanimously voted to approve the Nominating Committee Slate for the 2021 Executive Committee

Other Items

- Four outgoing Board Members were recognized for their service to Forward Pinellas – Pinellas County Commissioner Welch, Tarpon Springs Commissioner Donovan, Belleair Bluffs Vice Mayor Sofer and Pinellas Park Mayor Bradbury.
- Al Bartolotta, Forward Pinellas Planning Division Manager, was recognized for his 32 years of commitment and dedication to Pinellas County and Forward Pinellas. The team wishes him a wonderful and relaxing retirement.
- Forward Pinellas has received the PSTA Transit Rider Advisory Committee (TRAC) Superior Transit Access Recognition (STAR) Award for the collaboration, consensus building, and outreach efforts around the US 19 corridor, specifically for the section between SR 580 and Curlew Road, that focuses on encouraging transit oriented development that ensures safe pedestrian access and safe transit rider access every half-mile along US 19.

- The new driverless shuttle project, called AVA (Autonomous Vehicle Advantage) from PSTA will launch on November 23, 2020 in St. Petersburg.
- TBARTA approved a Regional Transportation Disadvantaged Service Program Agreement with USERV to contribute \$150,000 a year for marketing and support services.
- Forward Pinellas will undergo the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Quadrennial Certification on January 28, 2021 to make sure we are compliant with all federal laws and policies regarding Metropolitan Planning Organizations.
- Forward Pinellas will hold a Board Workshop on January 29, 2021 to discuss agency objectives and priorities for the coming year.
- Staff reported from the MPOAC meeting that collaboration between Forward Pinellas and PSTA was highlighted as a best practice and demonstrates significant efforts to model this type of coordination. In addition, the MPOAC approved policy positions that, among other points, calls for transportation funding to be more flexible across all modes of transportation.

- **Forward Pinellas Legislative Committee Update**

Following an update by the executive director, the board voted to support the draft position statement of the Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area (TMA) Leadership Group concerning legislative earmarks and improved flexibility for transit funding with one minor change suggested. The board recommended separating the second bullet point under the fifth suggestion into two bullet points. This would allow for separate consideration to be given to the indexing of the local-option fuel tax to inflation and the idea of allowing the larger municipalities in a county to enact an independent transportation surtax by referendum. SUMMARY

On November 20, 2020, the Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area (TMA) Leadership Group held a workshop to discuss their top priorities for transportation projects in the Tampa Bay area. Comprised of representatives from the Pinellas, Hillsborough and Pasco County MPO boards, the Tampa Bay TMA Leadership Group meets regularly to develop consensus on regional transportation priorities. Given that there are still a number of unfunded regional priorities, it was decided to simply advance the 2020 priorities approved by the TMA for the 2021 list.

The West Central Florida MPO Chairs Coordinating Committee (CCC) discussed their Regional Transportation Priority Projects list at their November 20 meeting. The CCC is made up of elected officials from each of the MPOs within its eight-county region, including Hernando, Citrus, Hillsborough, Pasco, Polk, Sarasota, Manatee and Pinellas. The CCC membership also includes representatives of the area's regional planning councils, FDOT Districts 1 and 7 and the Florida Turnpike Enterprise. Like the TMA Leadership Group, the CCC supported advancing the top priorities from the prior year to the 2021 list with the exception of those projects that are now scheduled and funded in the Work Program.

In accordance with the processes established through the CCC, the two priority lists will be forwarded to the Forward Pinellas Board for approval at their next meeting.

SUMMARY

The Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program provides federal funding for non-road building projects, such as the construction of bicycle and pedestrian facilities and projects that improve access to transit.

In July, Forward Pinellas released a Call for Projects, soliciting applications from local government partners for TA funding. Five applications were received and competitively scored using a set of criteria approved by the Forward Pinellas Board. The maximum number of points an application can receive is 75. SECTION I: NAME

The name of this committee shall be the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC).

SECTION II: PURPOSE

The Committee shall serve Forward Pinellas, in its role as the Pinellas County Metropolitan Planning Organization, in an advisory capacity pursuant to Federal Regulations (CRF), Title 23, Chapter 1, Part 450, Subpart A, Section 450.120, which requires the provision of public involvement within the Urban Transportation Planning Process and Coordination of Land Use.

A. The functions and responsibilities of the Committee shall include, but not be limited to, the following major areas:

1. Information

- Relate overall community needs and values, relative to planning goals and to future land use and transportation patterns.
- Establish comprehension and promote credibility for the planning process.
- Provide Citizen Committee knowledge of the planning process into local citizen group discussions and meetings.
- Promote better public dissemination of general information through mass circulation methods.

2. Issue Clarification and Problem Solving

- Evaluating and proposing solutions and alternatives on major transportation proposals and critical transportation issues.
- Determining general citizen attitudes and response to planning and programming issues.
- Articulating and interpreting the goals of the PATS program in program evaluation and information dissemination.
- Identification of existing transportation problem areas of general citizen concern.

SECTION III: MEMBERSHIP, COMPOSITION, APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATIONS, AND TERMS

A. The Citizens Advisory Committee shall be composed of one representative from the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority’s (PSTA) Transit Riders Advisory Committee (TRAC) and twenty-six (26) appointed persons from designated areas in the County as follows:

St. Petersburg Area	4

Anyone interested in serving on the CAC must complete a Forward Pinellas Advisory Committee Member application and attend at least one CAC meeting in order to be considered for appointment. This includes individuals recommended by Forward Pinellas Board members. Elected officials are not eligible to serve on the Committee. Considerations in the appointment of CAC members are listed below in order of priority.

1. Minority representation as reflected in population data for Pinellas County and the Forward Pinellas Board Title VI Plan.
2. Effect on balance of age and gender of the Committee.

3. Whether the candidate previously served on the Committee. Individuals without prior experience on the Committee shall be given preference over those who previously served.
4. For at-large positions, consideration shall be given to how the individual would affect the balance of geographic representation on the Committee. The geographical representation of at-large Committee members should be equitable to the fullest extent possible.

- B. A member having three or more consecutive absences or four or more absences during a twelve-month period shall require reconfirmation by the Forward Pinellas Board or membership shall be terminated. The reconfirmation process may make allowance for absences due to a major health-related condition.

Forward Pinellas shall appoint members of the Committee by affirmative action of the Forward Pinellas Board with the recommendation made by either the Board Chairman, a member of the Board, or the Forward Pinellas Director.

The term of appointment for each member shall be four years in duration unless the member resigns or until the membership is withdrawn by the Forward Pinellas Board. Members shall be limited to no more than two terms. An individual having served two terms may be appointed to another term or terms but must wait at least one year between appointments.

To initiate the term of office procedure, the Forward Pinellas Board will establish a staggered set of terms of 1, 2, 3, and 4 years using membership seniority, with the term of appointment starting January 1, 2005.

Concerning reappointment, that action would take into consideration the member's Committee participation, attendance, and the interest of other individuals in that membership.

SECTION IV: OFFICERS AND DUTIES

- A. A Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Committee shall be a citizen member and shall be elected at the last regularly-scheduled meeting of each calendar year and shall hold office for one year and until their successors are elected. The Chairman may not serve

more than two terms. The Chairman must have been a Committee member for at least two years, and the Vice Chairman must have been a Committee member for at least one year.

- B. Any member may nominate a citizen member to be an Officer. All elections shall be by the majority vote of regular members present.
- C. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings and shall be responsible for the agenda minutes and conduct of all meetings. The Chairman shall be responsible for pertinent Committee correspondence and information releases. The Chairman shall approve, with any necessary modifications, the agenda tentatively developed for him by the County Planning Department at least seven (7) days prior to any scheduled meeting. The Chairman shall also serve as a liaison between the Citizens Committee and the Metropolitan Planning Organization, whenever the need arises. Subcommittees and their Chairman may be appointed by the Chairman, with the approval of the Committee.
- D. The Vice Chairman shall, during the absence of the Chairman or his inability to serve, have and exercise all the duties and powers of the Chairman. The Vice Chairman shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned him by the Chairman.
- E. If both the Chairman and Vice Chairman are absent from a meeting, a temporary Chairman shall be provided by a majority vote of the members present. Any vacancy in office created by resignation or replacement of the Officer by the appointing Agency shall be filled by a majority vote of members present at the next regular meeting. The Officer so elected shall fill the remainder of the unexpired term of the vacant office.
- F. If, at any time, the Committee feels that an Officer is not performing his duties in accordance with Section 4, Subsection C, that Officer may be removed from office by a two-thirds vote of the members present at a regular meeting, provided that an item to that effect has been distributed in accordance with Section 4, Subsection C, of these Bylaws.

SECTION V: MEETINGS

- A. The Committee shall meet monthly at a date, time, and place acceptable to a majority of the membership. The date or time may be changed by a majority vote of the regular members if ten (10) days notice is given to the members. (If circumstances warrant, the Chairman may cancel or postpone a regular or special meeting and, if necessary, set a new date, time, and place for the meeting.)
- B. The Chairman may call special meetings whenever deemed necessary.
- C. A seven (7) day notice shall be given for regular meetings. Emergency or Special Meetings may be called with a minimum of three (3) days notice, indicating the reason for the meeting. The three (3) days notice for Emergency or Special Meetings will be conducted by telephone. Agendas shall be prepared prior to all meetings. Agendas should be mailed with meeting notices and minutes of the previous meeting approximately seven (7) days prior to any regular meeting and three (3) days prior to any Emergency or Special Meeting. Members may place items on the mail-out agenda with approval of the Chairman. Any item requiring Committee action may be brought before the Committee by any member with the Committee's approval, even though it is not on the agenda. The Committee shall decide if action is to be taken at that meeting or at a subsequent meeting.
- D. Whenever reports are to be given, copies will be prepared for each member of the Committee. When possible, said copies should be mailed with meeting notices.
- E. Each member shall have an equal vote.
- F. A quorum shall consist of one-third of the voting membership and shall be required for conduct of all official business. A majority of the quorum shall be necessary to decide an issue before the Committee.

SECTION VI: AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended by the affirmative vote of a majority of the regular members of the Committee, provided a copy of the proposed amendment(s) has been sent to every member approximately seven (7) days before it is voted on. All proposed amendments shall be voted on at regular meetings.

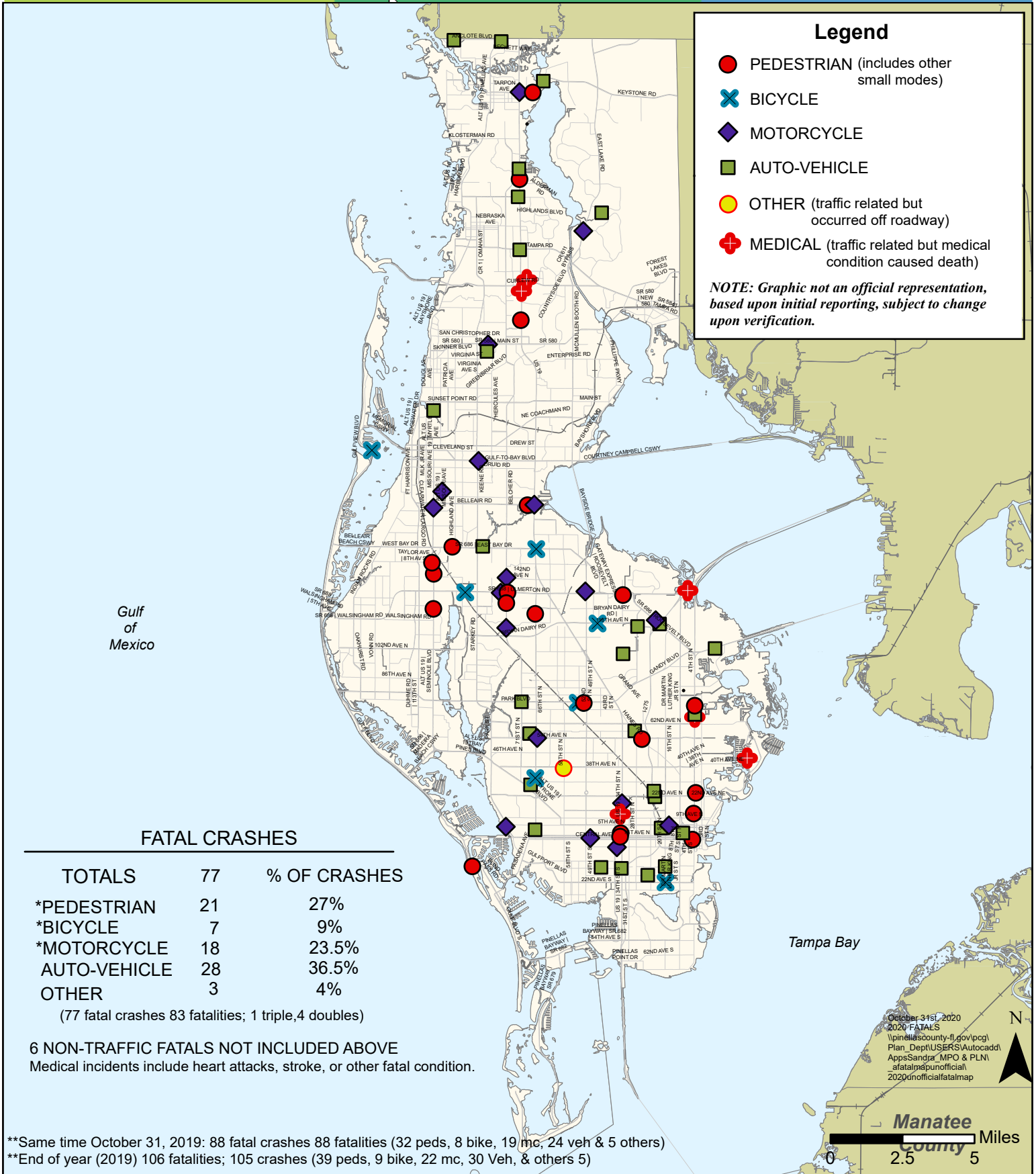
