### 1. CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE TO FLAG/INTRODUCTIONS

Robert Feigel, Forward Pinellas staff, reviewed the Zoom meeting guidelines and the attendees were announced by Maria Kelly, there were 27 attendees. Chair Karen Mullins called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Chair Mullins welcomed guests at this time.

### 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Bob Henion made a motion to approve the minutes. It was seconded by Gary Benjamin. The minutes were approved with one correction, item 7, the vote was 16 – 2 (Gary Benjamin opposed).

### 3. FORWARD PINELLAS ACTIONS

Chelsea Favero, Forward Pinellas Planning Manager, reviewed the highlights of the Forward Pinellas Board meeting for September 9, 2020. The Board discussed a couple of controversial land use cases, which up a large portion of the meeting. The Board also received the US19 Underpass presentation that this committee saw at their August meeting. That also generated a lot of discussion. The Board ultimately endorsed the inclusion of the pedestrian underpass in the design of the US19 corridor improvements north of SR 580. The action adhered to their previously approved policy position to support pedestrian crossing accommodations in the design of future improvements on US 19 North at ¼ to ½ mile intervals. The Board also received a presentation from TBARTA on the Regional Rapid Transit Project and an update from Mike Meidel, Pinellas County Economic Development Director, who spoke about the economic conditions of Pinellas County. Mr. Meidel noted that they are seeing continued interest in multifamily and industrial development countywide, while also observing a bit of a decrease in interest for new office development.

### 4. FY 2019/20 - FY 2023/24 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

There were no proposed TIP amendments.

### 5. FOLLOW-UP ON THE CAC BYLAWS

Robert Feigel, Forward Pinellas staff, reviewed the CAC Bylaws with the committee based on discussion in the August 27, 2020 meeting. The revised amendment is included with the agenda. It states that the Vice Chair shall assume all duties of the Chair, during an absence of the Chair, even if the Vice Chair has served for less than a year. This item was voted on in the last meeting but only in concept. This proposed amendment seeks to reflect this idea in the bylaws. Bob Henion made a motion to approve the change of the bylaws to reflect this change. This was seconded by Brian Scott and passed with a unanimous vote.

### 6. INTELLIGENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS (ITS)

Mr. Ken Jacobs, Pinellas County Transportation Division Director, shared a presentation on Pinellas County's Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS), which refers to an infrastructure of interconnected traffic signal and traffic condition surveillance equipment that can be remotely managed from a centralized location. Tampa Bay ranks 23rd on the annual congestion report of major cities throughout the United States. The ATMS and ITS are the tools used to make the roadway networks operate as efficiently as possible. Enhanced signal operations, better managed incidents and the provision of traveler information are just a few of the ATMS/ITS counter measures provided to help make the roadways safer. This system is utilized by multiple agencies for improved incident management and communicates with area emergency dispatch centers. Implementation of the ITS system in Pinellas County began in 2006 and, 14 years later, there are only a few more roads remaining to deploy ITS infrastructure on. Another initiative being implemented is the Smart Cities initiative. It involves the use of new smart technologies and smart sensors to collect transportation data, and then using that data to help better manage local transportation systems. A Pinellas County Smart Communities Advisory Committee has been created with County staff. This committee will be looking at the things currently being done and determining the priorities of the upcoming projects the County thinks will be of great benefit to citizens. The Tampa Bay Smart Cities Alliance is a group of

representatives from all the different cities and counties in the region that coordinate to develop priorities for how best to operate the transportation network, not just locally, but regionally. Connected Vehicle Technology is one of the newest ATMS safety devices which uses wireless radio communications with traffic signals, vehicles, pedestrians, bicycles, and infrastructure. Currently underway is a joint project with FDOT called the Connected Vehicle Pilot Project, where wireless infrastructure radios will be installed at 23 intersections along US19. With this project, if you have a corresponding wireless radio in your vehicle, when you drive down US19, the signals will tell you how much time it will be before arriving at the next intersection, the status of the signal phase, and whether there are emergency delays at the intersection. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

### 7. PSTA SUNRUNNER

Mr. Abhishek Dayal, PSTA Director of Project Management, shared a PowerPoint presentation with the committee regarding Tampa Bay's very first Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service, the SunRunner. The SunRunner will offer service from downtown St. Petersburg to St. Pete Beach. The Sunrunner will utilize 1st Avenue North, 1st Avenue South, Pasadena Avenue and Gulf Boulevard. The 10-mile route includes 16 stations/station pairs serving the cities of St. Petersburg, South Pasadena and St. Pete Beach. The buses will run in semi-dedicated Business Access and Transit (BAT) lanes which will also allow for business access and emergency vehicles. The lanes will be paved with redpigmented asphalt with way-side signage along the route. Hybrid-electric buses with interior bike racks and two extra-large passenger information screens will be used. Stations will be equipped with security cameras, elevated platforms and totems with video screens on both sides for real-time bus departure and ticket information. The anticipated project opening will be in early 2022. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

### 8. CITY OF ST. PETERSBURG MICROMOBILITY

Cheryl Stacks, City of St. Petersburg, reviewed the city's e-scooter pilot program with the committee. The primary reason for the program is to provide more mobility options for the residents and visitors of St. Petersburg, including first-mile/last-mile transit access. Once state legislation was passed in June of 2019, St. Petersburg began development of this program, which allows e-scooters on public streets in the city at a max of 20 mph. Based on feedback received during public outreach, the city has structured the program so that it has limited hours of operation, no sidewalk usage, parking in corrals only, a minimum operating age, and so that any available revenue will be invested into further development of a low-stress bike network as part of the city's Complete Streets Program. Regulations were put forward through the adoption of a city ordinance in October 2019, applying to all scooters with added rules for licensed agreements between e-scooter providers and the city. Two scooter providers were selected in the spring and agreements with them have been finalized. The City of St. Petersburg will create and manage the scooter parking corrals. The City of Tampa has partnered with USF for a scooter program as well. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

### 9. SAFE STREETS PINELLAS

Gloria Lepik-Corrigan shared a brief update with the committee on the vision zero effort called Safe Streets Pinellas. Vision Zero is a transportation safety strategy employed by communities across the world based on the principle that loss of life is not an acceptable price to pay for mobility. Vision Zero exists to eliminate traffic deaths and severe injuries with a proactive approach. In a vision zero effort like Safe Streets Pinellas, many diverse stakeholders come together to work toward creating a transportation system that is safe for everyone. The success depends on community involvement and collaboration with partner agencies. As part of Safe Streets Pinellas, Forward Pinellas and the Safe Streets Pinellas Task Force are analyzing collision data, developing engineering and non-engineering countermeasures, conducting demonstration projects and ultimately developing an Action Plan to reach the goal of zero fatalities. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

# 5. Fall Update of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments

### **SUMMARY**

Each year in the Fall Forward Pinellas updates its Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to include the recently adopted transportation work programs of the local governments. Although metropolitan planning organizations are only required to provide information on federal- and state-funded transportation projects, Forward Pinellas has historically included the transportation projects in adopted local government capital improvement programs through its annual fall update. This provides citizens, businesses and other public agencies that reference the TIP with a more comprehensive report of scheduled transportation projects located throughout Pinellas County.

Pinellas County's transportation work program is adopted each year as part of its Capital Improvement Program (CIP). It is the largest local government work program contained in the TIP. Summary tables representing the transportation section of the CIP are attached. The summary tables include information on the status of the projects and any changes that have occurred from the previous year's work program. Projects that have changed since the prior year are shaded. Also included are the work program tables of the various local governments, local airports, Port of St. Petersburg, Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5310 Grant Program allocations. 


# Pinellas County Work Program FY 2020-2026 Major Transportation and ATMS Projects Map 1 of 4






# Pinellas County Work Program FY 2020-2026 Major Transportation and ATMS Projects Map 2 of 4










# Pinellas County Work Program FY 2020-2026 Bridges, Sidewalks and Trails Map 1 of 2

### **SUMMARY**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recognizes that due to the location, complexity, and volume of traffic that passes through Tampa's Westshore Interchange (I-275/SR60), the reconstruction of this interchange and the improvements along I-275 to Downtown Tampa may be complicated for motorists to navigate. This is why FDOT is working on a comprehensive approach to ensure safety and mobility during the reconstruction of the Westshore Interchange through a new initiative called SafeTRIP.

SafeTRIP is a comprehensive strategy that will address **T**raffic Management, **R**egional Demand, Innovation and Smart Work Zones, and **P**ublic Engagement (TRIP). FDOT's vision for SafeTRIP is a well-planned and innovative construction zone environment that maintains safety and reliability for the local community, traveling public, and construction workers by providing quality transportation choices, strategic innovation, and proactive communication.

Margaret Kubilins, PE and FDOT SafeTRIP Program Engineer, is overseeing this effort for District 7. Ms. Kubilins will provide an overview of the program and respond to questions.

Both the FTP and the SHSP share the vision of a fatality-free roadway system to protect Florida's 20 million residents and more than 105 million annual visitors.


