

- Forward Pinellas has a High Injury Network and crash hot spots that we are working with our partners to address.
- We've analyzed our most severe crashes and trends to better understand who was involved, the types of crashes and physical location. This helps us to pair solutions with known problem areas, and address future potential concerns before they worsen.
- Our Action Plan includes a next steps related to education, engineering, funding and legislation.
