SUMMARY

In accordance with Section 339.175, F.S., the Governor is required to review the membership composition of each metropolitan planning organization (MPO) in conjunction with the decennial Census, and to apportion it as necessary to comply with state and federal requirements. The Apportionment Plan is necessary to identify the voting membership and rotational seat terms for all Forward Pinellas Board members.

At its May board meeting, Forward Pinellas staff presented a range of options for the board to consider in developing a new Apportionment Plan. The board discussed the requests received from municipal partners for individual seats and weighed those requests against the need to maintain proportionate representation amongst the board members. Subsequently, the City of Clearwater also submitted a formal request for an additional seat on the Forward Pinellas Board.

At its July meeting, the board took up the apportionment discussion again. Forward Pinellas staff presented a recommended alternative for the board to discuss and consider. The alternative addressed the requests from municipal partners for seats on the board, comments made by board members that any plan moving forward provide for more proportionate representation from all members, while also adhering to the legal requirements that the Board of County Commissioners retain a minimum of 20% of the seats and that a seat be retained for the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA).

During the discussion at the July meeting, another alternative evolved for consideration that would expand the board to 19 members, including a new seat for Tarpon Springs and additional seats for the cities of St. Petersburg and Clearwater, and Pinellas County. This alternative would retain staff's recommendation to split the inland communities into two groups of three rotating seats.

However, the board was unable to achieve the 10 votes necessary to adopt a final Apportionment Plan. The board directed staff to schedule a special meeting to take up the subject again as soon as possible and before the end of August.

Forward Pinellas staff will provide an overview of the current apportionment alternatives, including the one recommended by staff and the new alternative that arose out of the July board meeting, and seek board support for a final Apportionment Plan. Once approved by the board, each jurisdiction in the county will be asked to sign a resolution of support for the Apportionment Plan and the final Plan will be transmitted to the Governor for review and approval by November 2023. The staff recommendation is presented alongside the other options as discussed at the July board meeting.


MPO PROPOSED APPORTIONMENT PLAN

MPO Apportionment

- Identifies the geographic area and voting membership of an MPO
- Apportionment Plan must be based on population ratio and approved by ³/₄ of board members
- 20% of seats must be for BCC members and PSTA must have a seat
- Must be approved by 75% of voting membership
 - Minimum of 10 votes in support

- Upon approval by the Governor, Interlocal Agreement establishing the MPO will be updated and signed by all local governments
