

# Multimodal Priority List


- Review and adopt annually
- 'Off the top' priorities ranked highest
- Projects remain on the list until completed
  - Two-tiered priority list: funded versus unfunded projects
- 'Off the top' priorities ranked highest
- New projects added according to scoring process approved in 2020

- Other Considerations:
- Project Readiness
- Countywide Significance
- Public and local government support

## New Project Priorities

- 1st Ave S Intersection Improvements
  - Annual complete streets priority project
- Sidewalk Gaps on State Roads
  - Various locations; prioritized with Forward Pinellas input
  - Carbon Reduction Funds
- I-175 PDE
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>; 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> one-way conversions
- 78<sup>th</sup> Ave N 66<sup>th</sup> St to 49<sup>th</sup> St
- 22<sup>nd</sup> Ave N 58<sup>th</sup> St to 4<sup>th</sup> St





# Other Changes

- 22<sup>nd</sup> St S (multiple projects)
  - CST deferred to 27/28 at request of City of St. Pete
- 580 Corridor Study
  - Underway
- Duke Energy Trail/SR 60 Crossing
  - CST in current fiscal year
- Gulf Blvd Sidewalks in Indian Shores
  - PE in 23/24
- I-275 Managed lanes and lane continuity
  - Broken into phases
- Pinellas Trail Loop
  - San Martin project description updated




# **Transportation Alternatives**



# Eligible Projects

- Pedestrian and bicycle projects
- Infrastructure to improve non-driver access to transit service





# **Program Structure**

- Minimum Award: \$300k
- Max Award: \$3 million
- 3 submittals per jurisdiction
- After 3 years, projects will be removed from the list

#### Prerequisites:

- Local Commitment
- 100% of ROW or easement
- LAP Certification





# Newly Funded

#### 46th St N

- 38<sup>th</sup> Ave N to 54<sup>th</sup> Ave N sidewalks
- Design 26/27

#### 6<sup>th</sup> St

- 4<sup>th</sup> Ave S to Mirror Lake Dr separated bike lane
- CST 27/28

## 28<sup>th</sup> St S

- 18<sup>th</sup> Ave S to 5<sup>th</sup> Ave S separated bike lane
- CST 27/28







#### **New Priorities**

#### Pinellas Trail Neighborhood Connections

Multiple locations in St. Pete

#### Sunset Beach Connector

- 4.4 mile bike/ped infrastructure improvements
- Howard Causeway through Klosterman

### **Disston Ave Complete Streets**

- Klosterman to Live Oak Blvd
- Sidewalks and intersection improvements

#### 26th Ave S Trail

Skyway Trail/38<sup>th</sup> St to 21<sup>st</sup> St

#### **Grand Central District Crossings**

Intersection improvements throughout district
