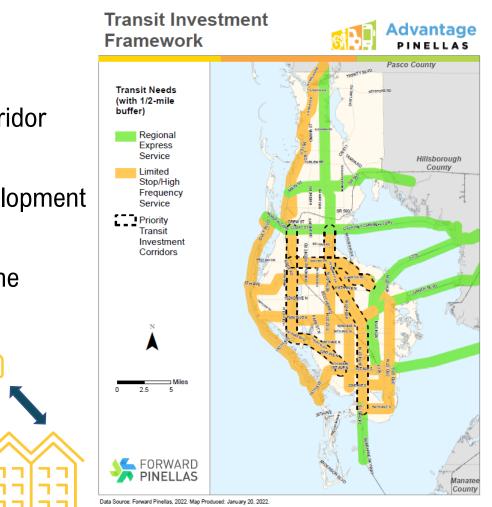
#### Investing in People and Places along the Alternate US 19 Corridor

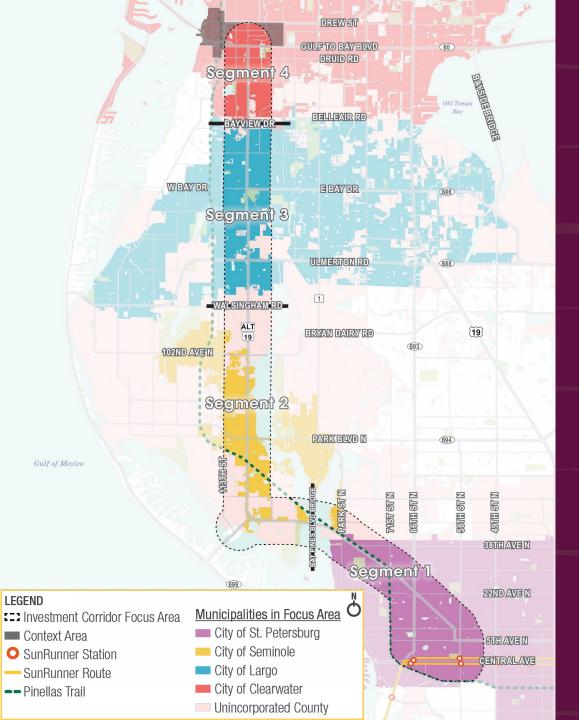
## **Study Purpose**

ALT 19

- Identify what types of development exist along the Alt 19 corridor now and what the community would like to see in the future
- Use this information to develop a strategy to allow for redevelopment in a way that addresses community needs
- Address transportation barriers that exist along and around the corridor to increase accessibility and connectivity to it

*Goal:* To provide people with better access from their homes to their jobs and job training opportunities via reliable transportation options including enhanced transit service.



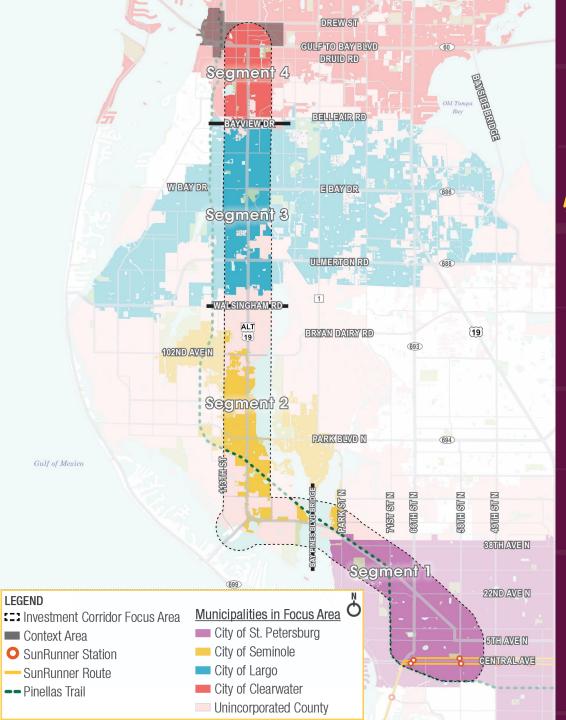


#### **Study Area**

- Half-mile around Alternate US 19 from SR 60 in Clearwater to 58<sup>th</sup> Street N in St. Petersburg
- Downtown Clearwater added as a context area for transportation analysis (Park Street Terminal is a key origin and destination for transit riders)

#### • Four segments

- Segment 1: St. Petersburg, Seminole, & Unincorporated County
- Segment 2: Seminole & Unincorporated County
- Segment 3: Largo & Unincorporated County
- Segment 4: Clearwater & Unincorporated County



#### **Corridor Demographics**

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Corridor Population: 76,000 (2022)

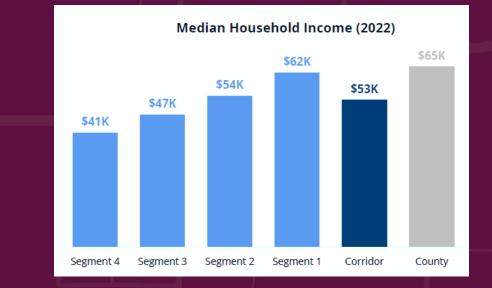
• 8% share of total County Population

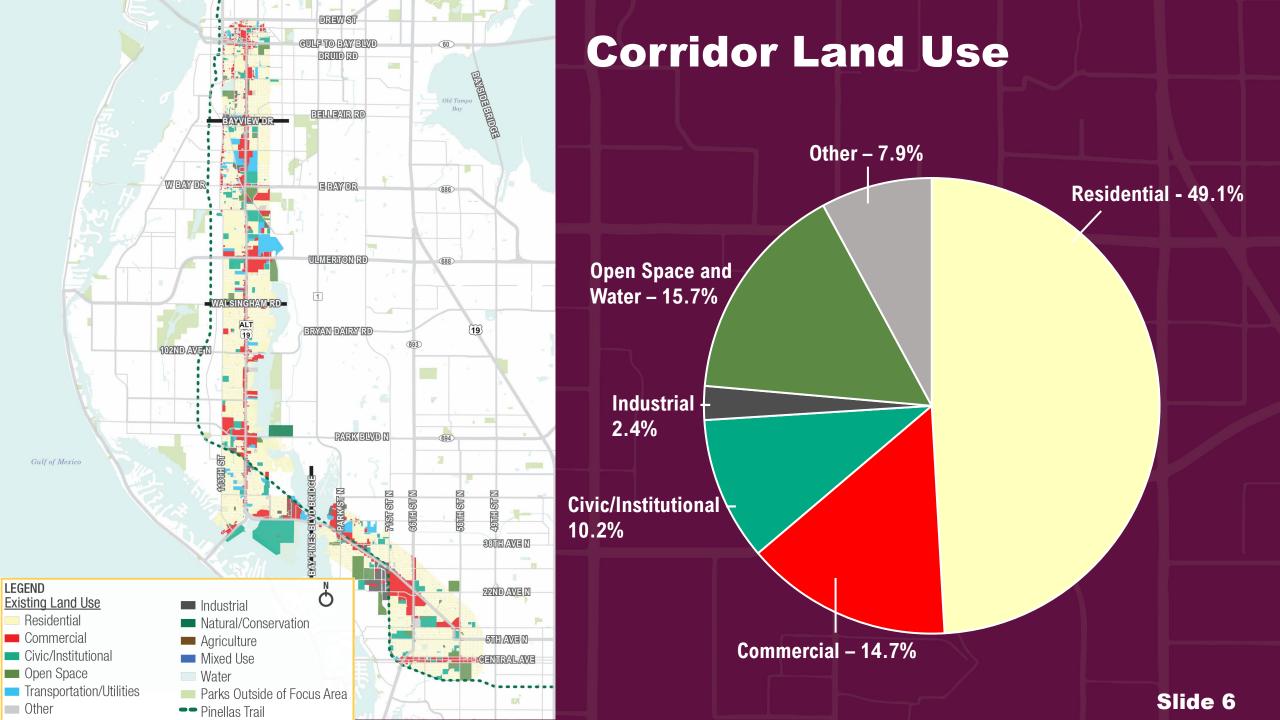
Corridor Jobs: 30,000 (2019)

• 8% share of total County jobs

#### Median Household Income for the Corridor: \$53,000

Tampa-St. Pete-Clearwater MSA Median Family Income = \$82,100







#### **Corridor Safety**

11,930 Total Crashes (2017-2021)
575 Crashes involving a bicyclist or pedestrian
314 Total Serious Injury Crashes
53 Total Fatalities

56.6%

Fatal crashes involve a pedestrian or bicyclist

**30.3%** Serious injury crashes involve a pedestrian or bicyclist

Crashes involving a bicyclist or pedestrian account for only 4.4% of total crashes, but disproportionately result in fatalities or serious injuries.



## **Public Transit**

- Alt 19 is primarily served by PSTA Route 18
  - One of PSTA's core transit routes
  - Second-highest ridership in the system
  - Corridor covers 5 Direct Connect locations
    - Allows riders to access discounted Uber, Lyft, taxi, and wheelchair van trips to/from the Direct Connect location

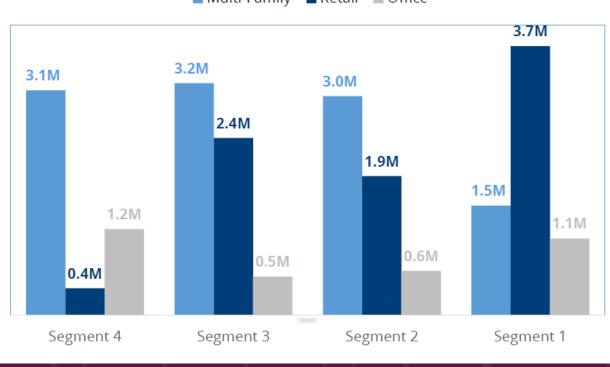
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- Transit riders used Route 18 during June 2022
- Of total transit ridership in the Corridor is on Route 18
- PSTA stops with more than 20 riders per month

Major transfer centers (Park Street Terminal, Largo Mall, Seminole City Center, and Tyrone Square Mall)

#### **Market Assessment**

• The corridor supports more than 24 million square feet of multifamily, retail, and office development/



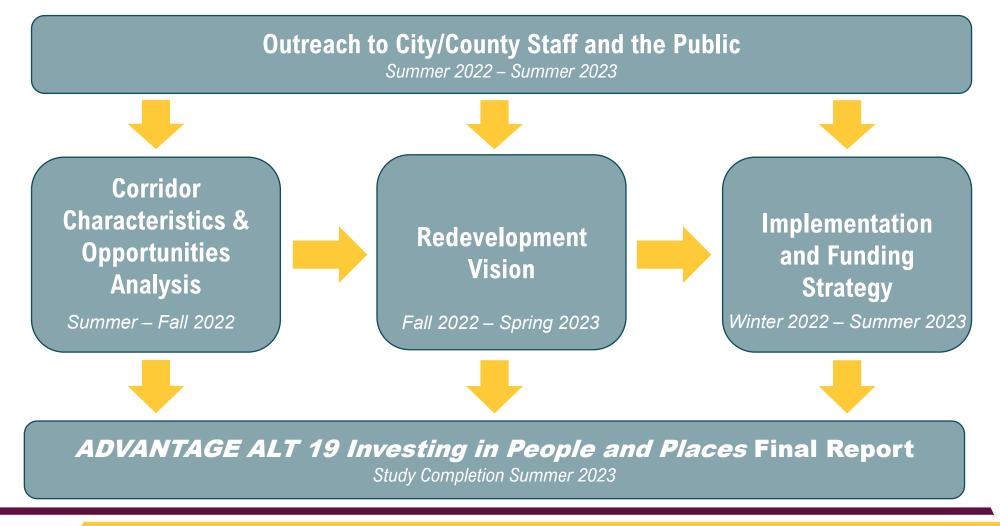
#### Total Square Footage in Corridor by Use

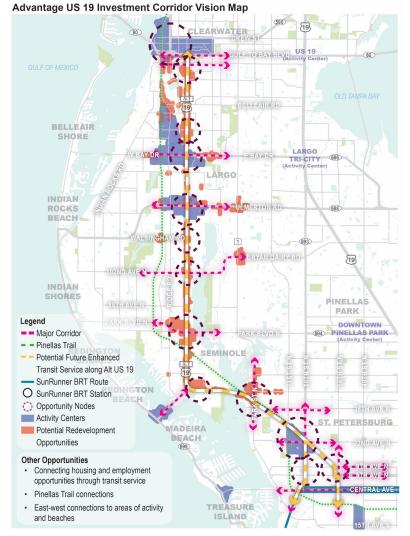
## What's Next?

  - Funding and policy strategies to achieve the redevelopment vision at corridor-wide, municipal, and station area level
