1. CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE TO FLAG/INTRODUCTIONS

Bill Jonson, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Attendees in the room introduced themselves.

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comment

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The summary of the January 25, 2024, meeting was approved with one change from page four, future agenda items, Hurricane Impact CRA should read Hurricane Impact CRS.

4. FORWARD PINELLAS ACTIONS

Rob Feigel, Forward Pinellas staff, reviewed the highlights of the Forward Pinellas Board meeting for February 14, 2024. The Board recommended approval of the amendments to the Countywide Plan presented. Whit Blanton shared the Regional Activities Report which included updates on the proposed MPO Merger. The Board also approved the Safety Measures and Targets presented and received a presentation on the Multimodal Impact Fee Ordinance.

5. FY 2023/24 - FY 2027/28 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

There were no TIP amendments.

6. LAND USE 101 PRESENTATION

Linda Fisher, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a presentation on Land Use. Forward Pinellas works with 25 local government partners to advance transportation projects and land use plans. In its land use capacity, the Forward Pinellas Board is advisory to the Board of County Commissioners, who act as the *Countywide Planning Authority* for land use. That means the County has the final vote on land use matters, but Forward Pinellas still does most of the actual countywide planning and coordination. The Countywide Plan for Pinellas County (CWP) guides land use planning among the 25 local governments and partner agencies in Pinellas County. The goals of the Countywide Plan are coordinated with Advantage Pinellas to concentrate home and jobs on future transit investment corridors, design land use to support transit, create diversity of housing for all incomes, attract and retain high wage jobs and build more resiliency. Discussion ensued where questions were taken and appropriately answered.

7. ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS & HOUSING ACTION PLAN

Ms. Fisher also provided a presentation on the Housing Action Plan and Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU). The Housing Action Plan is a partnership between Forward Pinellas and Pinellas County government. Pinellas County has been seeing double digit increases in housing costs for multiple years in a row and rents are also increasing. While standard practice is that housing should cost no more than 30% of a household's gross income, one out of every three households in Pinellas County are cost burdened and for renters it is more than half. Ms. Fisher provided an overview of the Housing Action Plan and discussed the role

that Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) can play in providing affordable housing options in our county. It was noted that some neighborhoods already have ADUs, and they can integrate seamlessly into existing neighborhoods, if appropriately planned and constructed. An ADU serves unique needs such as more housing options, smaller lower cost units, multigenerational living arrangements and sometimes an income source for property owners. ADU's are an ancillary or secondary living unit that has a separate kitchen, bathroom and sleeping area existing either within the same structure or on the same lot as the primary dwelling unit. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

8. DRAFT UPWP

Chelsea Favero, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a presentation on the FY25-26 Unified Planning Work Program. The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is a two-year plan that identifies a metropolitan planning organization's (MPO) transportation planning activities and associated funding. State and federal transportation funding agencies provide guidance on required elements and timeframes for review and adoption of the UPWP, but the way the MPO allocates its funding for the various planning activities is at the discretion of the MPO. Forward Pinellas is currently developing the UPWP for July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2026. The draft must be submitted to state and federal review agencies by mid-March. After the review, agencies have an opportunity to comment on the draft. The final UPWP must be adopted by Forward Pinellas in May. The UPWP includes introductory sections that discuss the MPO's functions and the planning priorities of the MPO, state and federal governments. This is followed by task pages and budget information that details staff support activities, consultant work and associated grant funding. Discussion ensued where questions were taken and appropriately answered. A motion was made by Caron Schwartz to endorse the staff recommendation for board approval. This was seconded by Haley Busch and passed with a unanimous vote.

9. ADVANTAGE PINELLAS UPDATE (OUTREACH PHASE II)

Ms. Favero shared that Forward Pinellas has begun Phase II of the Advantage Pinellas outreach activities, with a focus on prioritizing investments in various transportation projects. Outreach activities like LocalTopia in St. Petersburg, are taking place and the updated outreach website is gathering feedback that align with this phase of the plan development. Committee members were reminded they too can participate at www.advantagepinellas2050.org and be entered for the prize raffle. The first phase of outreach focused on transportation challenges and the second phase is asking how funding should be prioritized. A statistically valid survey has been completed as well as two Focus Groups with a preferred solutions exercise. Members were also reminded to share with staff any public events happening in their community that they would like to see Forward Pinellas participating in. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

10. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Pinellas SPOTLight Emphasis Areas Update

Regarding the US19 Corridor, staff has been working with FDOT on preliminary concepts for what the corridor could look like north of Tampa Road. A tentative schedule has this item coming back to the CAC at the April meeting. Regarding the Gateway area, a new planner has rejoined us, Nousheen Rahman. She will be focused on Special Projects, including in the Gateway area. Access to the Beach continues to charge ahead with staff

continuing to expand the ferry services.

B. Safe Streets and Roads 4 All

All five projects for Dunedin, Oldsmar, Pinellas County, St. Petersburg/Gulfport and Largo are currently underway. The City of Dunedin City Commission held a meeting, and they got their first look at some of the recommendations for the Beltrees corridor. Regarding 49th Street S in St. Petersburg and Gulfport, the recommendations have been drafted. Largo just kicked off recently, and Oldsmar has not kicked off yet, but it is coming. There is another round of funding for this program that Forward Pinellas is considering applying for.

THE PLANNING COUNCIL AND METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR PINELLAS COUNTY

The Forward Pinellas Board held this public meeting in person on March 13, 2024, at 1 p.m. in the Palm Room at the Pinellas County Communications Building.

The board approved the draft FY 2024/25-2025/26 Unified Planning Work Program.

Chelsea Favero presented the draft Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for fiscal year 2024/25-2025/26. The UPWP is a two-year plan that identifies a metropolitan planning organization's (MPO) transportation planning activities and associated funding. The draft must be submitted to state and federal review agencies by mid-March and the final UPWP must be adopted by Forward Pinellas in May.

The board recommended approval of the following amendments to the Countywide Plan Map.

- Case CW 24-05 A request from the City of Tarpon Springs to amend 0.88 acres of property located at 1201 Gulf Road from Retail & Services to Public/Semi-Public. The city is requesting the amendment to accommodate the new Tarpon Springs Fire Station 70, which is currently in the design phase.
- Case CW 24-06 A request from the City of Safety Harbor to amend 0.82 acres of property located at 675 Elm Street from Public/Semi-Public to Residential LowMedium. This case involves multiple parcels that will be owned by Habitat for Humanity of Pinellas County, Inc. The city proposes to amend their future land use map for this site to increase the maximum allowable density to allow for Habitat for Humanity homes to be constructed.

Discussion:

- Commissioner Eggers inquired how many units are planned to be built? Marcie Stenmark, from the City of Safety Harbor, answered that they plan to build six houses.
- Case CW 24-07 A request from the City of Safety Harbor to amend 5.07 acres of property located west of Elm St. and south of Cedar St. from Public/Semi-Public to Recreation/Open Space. The Safety Harbor Secondary School that was located on the property was demolished in 2009. The subject property is being conveyed to the City of Safety Harbor for a future park.

Case CW 24-08 – A request from the City of St. Petersburg to amend 1.35 acres of property located at the southeast corner of Hartford Street North and 32nd Avenue North from Residential Medium to Multimodal Corridor. The property is owned by the St. Petersburg Housing Authority and the purpose of the proposed amendments is to allow for multifamily housing units, two additional bonus workforce housing units, and nine environmental Transferrable Development Rights (TDR) housing units. It would also permit commercial iuses to be potentially developed.

Discussion:

- David Ballard Geddis Jr. provided a public comment stating that in addition to housing availability attention should also be paid to job availability and resource availability.
- Case CW 24-09 A request from the City of St. Petersburg to amend 5.24 acres of property located at 7045 Burlington Avenue North from Public/Semi-Public to Residential Medium. The property has been owned and operated as an accessory wellness center by St. Petersburg College. The City of St. Petersburg has offered to purchase the property to construct affordable housing units. Up to 30% of the units will be allocated to St. Petersburg College students and staff.

Forward Pinellas staff provided an update on the Housing Action Plan.

Linda Fisher provided this bi-monthly briefing which focused on the unique needs of the senior population and the challenges they face in affording housing.

Discussion:

- Commissioner Eggers commented on the Baby Boomers' potential effect on the housing supply. As they sell off assets and/or downsize from single-family homes to apartments more housing may become available.
- Commissioner Scott asked if we are tracking the inventory of housing that uniquely suits seniors. Linda noted this is being investigated as part of the housing action plan.
- Councilmember Allbritton noted the City of Clearwater has discussed changing the codes to be more accepting of accessory dwelling units (ADUs).
- Mayor Bujalski noted Dunedin had previously changed codes for ADUs, at the time of the last recession. Dwellers had to present proof of relationship. There has been little movement on the matter since then. Without caveats such as these, it opens the doors to vacation rentals and other unintended uses.
- Whit Blanton inquired when the public communication strategy will be presented to the board? Linda responded that it is planned for May.

Forward Pinellas staff shared an overview of this year's In-Service Day.

Tina Jablon presented an overview of this year's In-Service Day. Forward Pinellas volunteered with the St. Pete Bike Co-op, a local non-profit that provides bike repair/maintenance, bike donations, and bicycle education. Forward Pinellas was also invited by the Property Appraiser's Office to educate its staff on the role Forward Pinellas plays in the county for their In-Service Day training event.

SPOTlight Update

Executive Director Whit Blanton provided the following updates:

- Whit met with the Florida Department of Transportation to discuss the Gulf to Bay and Belcher Road intersection study, which investigates the traffic bottleneck. The County has asked FDOT to complete the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study and move forward on the project. Forward Pinellas has encouraged FDOT to also consider the entire corridor and not only the one intersection. FDOT and Pinellas County are continuing to meet on the matter and will involve City of Clearwater staff as well.
- Waterborne transportation At the last St. Petersburg Chamber meeting the scoping for an
 Urban Land Institute (ULI) Technical Assistance Panel was discussed to look into service to
 connect St. Petersburg to South Hillsborough County, particularly the Apollo Beach area, as
 there is heavy workforce opportunity to connect jobs and housing. Forward Pinellas has begun
 discussions with a consultant to do potentially conduct a market demand analysis, and will
 reconvene the Waterborne Transportation Committee as the scoping and work effort for the
 ULI panel evolves.

Other Items

- Regional Activities Report:
 - At its last meeting, the TMA leadership group discussed the governing board structure for a potential regional MPO. They found consensus regarding the role of regional transportation operators. These would be considered regional entities and, thus, should not come out of Hillsborough's voting allocation by population, so long as the representative from these regional entities is not an elected official. The role of transit operators will be discussed at the next meeting and the role of smaller cities in the fall.
 - The TMA leadership group also unanimously approved a statement to encourage
 Brightline to build a new segment from Orlando to Tampa, as well as the expansion of
 Amtrak in the Interstate 4 corridor. The Forward Pinellas Board endorsed the statement,
 which will be shared with the other MPOs in the I-4 corridor for their consideration.
- Whit Blanton provided the following legislative updates (not an exhaustive list):
 - House Bill 1487 did not pass. It would have reorganized the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority's governing structure.
 - SB 1032 / HB 7049 did not pass. It entailed significant revisions to the operations of MPOs, such as tracking burdensome performance metrics, and the elimination of the MPO Advisory Council.

- HB 1301 passed and will require any governmental entity proposing to repurpose existing traffic lanes to conduct a traffic study, notify all affected property owners and local governments 180 days in advance, and hold a public meeting 30 days in advance.
- SB 328 passed regarding affordable housing. The bill originally proposed to delete industrial from eligible types of land and reduce the preemption of building height, but those provisions were removed due to opposition from the real estate industry.
- Regarding the 34th Street South complete streets project Representative Chaney has organized a town hall meeting on Monday, March 25, 6-8 pm, at St. Pete Beach Community Center. There will be a panel discussion that includes Whit, a representative from PSTA, FDOT, and the City of St. Petersburg.
 - Councilmember Floyd expressed concern for the location of the meeting. He wants to ensure the voices of those who live around this project are heard.
 - Whit Blanton has mentioned to FDOT and the City of St. Petersburg to have a meeting with the Skyway Marina District since they, initially, propelled this project idea forward.
- Whit Blanton provided a summary of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Ranking Exercise from the February Forward Pinellas Board Work Session. As part of the exercise, board members ranked various modes of transportation for future investment priority. Premium transit turned out to be the mode with the most consensus for priority.
- Public engagement policy discussion:
 - O Whit Blanton clarified that Forward Pinellas is a conduit for projects that initially come as a request from the local governments or FDOT. Forward Pinellas does not create and push out projects to communities. Forward Pinellas is considering a public engagement policy for approved and prioritized projects that are advancing through the state's fiveyear work program and the MPO's adopted Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).
 - Commissioner Eggers noted the need for more targeted outreach, such as using an email database organized by geographic areas and specific topic areas of interest. Whit Blanton noted Forward Pinellas is currently collecting emails via the advantagepinellas2050.org website.
 - Vice Mayor Knapp shared that the City of Oldsmar adopted a public engagement policy last year based on a model by the International Association of Public Participation. It outlines a spectrum of engagement, from informing to empowering. As a project comes up, you can reference the model to determine what level of engagement is needed or desired for that specific project.
- Public Comment: David Ballard Geddis Jr. provided a general critique of the process government takes to solve problems.

6. Modification to the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan



SUMMARY

Advantage Pinellas is the long-range transportation plan (LRTP) for the Forward Pinellas MPO. Last adopted in 2019 with a horizon year of 2045, the LRTP includes the transportation projects that are eligible for state and federal funding in Pinellas County. Projects included in the Plan move into the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) as they advance and begin to receive funding. In order for the Florida Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration to determine planning consistency and advance these projects, the project descriptions and limits must match exactly across all planning documents.

FPN 441250-1 references Gandy Blvd from east of 4th St to West Shore Blvd. This project has been progressing through the planning process and is now ready to be funded for design. When the 2045 LRTP was adopted, it was anticipated that this project would be funded in the 2026–2030-time band. However, FDOT is now seeking to fund the project in the 2020–2025-time band. In order to ensure planning document consistency, a modification to the LRTP is required to adjust the time band for design funding.

Forward Pinellas staff will provide an overview of the project and answer questions from committee members.

8. Forward Pinellas Transit System Plan



SUMMARY

The Forward Pinellas Transit System Plan is a component of the broader Advantage Pinellas 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan. The Transit System Plan utilizes the Forward Pinellas Investment Corridor framework to identify corridors with the greatest potential for transit readiness based on Federal Transit Authority (FTA) established standards. The goal of this effort is to identify the top performing corridors that with the right investments and strategic landuse planning could best foster redevelopment, continued ridership, and benefit the overall transit network. Combined with the Community Bus Plan under development by PSTA, the Transit System Plan will serve as the unconstrained 'Needs' plan for transit in the LRTP, with the highest ranked corridors being advanced for implementation in the near term. This implementation will include close coordination with PSTA and our local government partners to ensure land-use policies align with future transit investments across the county that further the Transit System Plan goals.





9. Draft Transportation Priorities



SUMMARY

Forward Pinellas adopts project priority lists for its Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on an annual basis. These lists are used for the allocation of federal funding. These lists include Multimodal Transportation Priority, Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Projects, and Regional Transportation Priority Projects. The approved priority lists are used by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) in the development of its Five-Year Work Program. A description of these lists and proposed changes to each are provided in the discussions that follow. These lists are presented as drafts for review and comment only. Final lists will be brought back to the committee for final action in May.

A. Multimodal Priority List

Since the last update of this list in 2023, five projects were allocated funding for implementation and are being moved from the 'Unfunded' section of the list and one funded project has been completed and is being removed from the list. Staff is also proposing to the complete streets project that was approved for prioritization by the Board. Several project descriptions of existing priorities are also being updated. Projects shaded in gray on the table indicate a change to the status or details of the project have been made. Forward Pinellas staff will provide an overview of proposed changes to the list.






