1. CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE TO FLAG/INTRODUCTIONS

Tammy Vrana, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Attendees in the room introduced themselves. At this time, the Chair advised the committee that Florida law requires a quorum of the CAC to be physically present to conduct business, however, the law provides an exception for some members to participate by non-physical means if a quorum is physically present and if the physical quorum present decides that there are extraordinary circumstances. At this time, Chair Vrana read a statement regarding allowing committee members present to make a motion to allow those members participating by Zoom (all names identified above) to participate and vote due to extenuating circumstances existing that make it impossible for some committee members to attend in person. A motion was made by Bill Jonson that due to Covid-19, extenuating circumstances exist that prevent members from joining in person. Therefore, they will be allowed to participate and vote by phone since a quorum is represented in person. This was seconded by Loretta Statsick and passed with a unanimous vote.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Dimitri Karides addressed one error on the March 25, 2021 minutes, at the top of page one, the date states February 25, 2021. Dimitri Karides made a motion to approve with the March 25, 2021 minutes with the one correction. It was seconded by Gloria Lepik-Corrigan and passed with a unanimous vote.

3. FORWARD PINELLAS ACTIONS

Mr. Feigel reviewed the highlights of the Forward Pinellas Board meeting for April 14, 2021. The Board received a few presentations beginning with Transit Oriented Development by Christina Mendoza, Forward Pinellas staff. The Draft Multimodal Priorities discussion, where no action was taken, and this item appears on the agenda for tonight. There will be a Board Workshop follow up on the SPOTLight Emphasis Areas, potentially adding a new SPOTLight area. A presentation was given by Sarah Caper, Forward Pinellas staff on the Downtown St. Petersburg Mobility update.

4. FY 2020/21- FY 2024/25 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Jaren Austin, Forward Pinellas staff, presented a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) modification for the current 2020/21-2024/25 Transportation Improvement Program. Forward Pinellas receives state and federal grant funding through the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for its planning activities identified in the two-year Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Every two years, this funding is reviewed against current and anticipated UPWP projects. Any funds left over in the current fiscal year need to be incorporated into the new fiscal year. These changes have already been accounted for in the UPWP but must now be reflected in the TIP. In addition, the TIP must reflect the adjusted Metropolitan Planning (PL) fund amounts Forward Pinellas will budget in the UPWP regardless of the deobligation. Loretta Statsick made a motion to recommend approval of the modification of the TIP to the Forward Pinellas Board. This was seconded by Tony Stillo and passed with a unanimous vote.

5. LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN (LRTP) MODIFICATION

Ms. Chelsea Favero, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a presentation with the committee on the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Modification. This LRTP identifies all the needed transportation investments needed between now and 2045. If a project is not identified in the LRTP, it cannot be funded through the Five-Year Work Program. Given that the most recent adoption of the LRTP was in 20219 meetings with Federal Highway Administration and the FDOT have determined that although the project cost information is documented, there should be more detail. This modification to the Plan is to bring in those additional project cost details. Modifications to Table 8.1 of the Plan and the Appendix C are being proposed to add this more detailed project cost information and to ensure Advantage Pinellas includes full documentation of its cost feasibility. The total project costs and revenues of Advantage Pinellas are not changing as a result of this modification. Questions were taken and appropriately answered. Axl David made a motion to recommend approval of this modification to the Advantage Pinellas, 2045 LRTP by the Forward Pinellas Board. This was seconded by Tony Stillo and passed with a unanimous vote.

6. ANNUAL ADOPTION OF PRIORITIES

Ms. Favero, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a presentation on the Draft 2021 Priority List. Forward Pinellas adopts project priority lists for the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on an annual basis. These lists are used for the allocation of federal funding and once approved, are used by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) in the development of its Five-Year Work Program. Each list was presented separately and is summarized as follows:

- 1) Multimodal Priority List: This list consists of all modes of transportation and was last updated in 2020. The current list has four projects that moved from the unfunded section to the funded section due to allocated funding for implementation. Being proposed for addition on the list is one complete streets construction project, two projects from the Active Transportation Plan and three projects that applied for funding through the Multimodal Priority List 2020 Call for Projects. Two projects that were placeholders for funding were removed from the list and the Aerial Transit Feasibility and Operations Plan is being removed as it is currently being completed by TBARTA. Tony Stillo made a motion to recommend approval of the 2021 Multimodal Transportation Project Priorities to the Forward Pinellas Board. This was seconded by Dylan Carlson and passed with a unanimous vote.
- **2) Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program Priority List:** This list was last updated in 2020, and since that time, one project has been allocated full funding and another project has received design funding. Staff is proposing to add four new projects, which applications were received for during the 2020 Call for Projects. They are as follows: 1) Pinellas Park: construction of a multiuse path on the north side of 118th Ave N from Belcher Road to 62nd Street N. 2) City of St. Petersburg: construction of a multiuse path along 28th Street from 1st Avenue N to 13th Avenue N. 3) Pinellas County: construction of sidewalks along 46th Street N. from 54th Avenue N. to 38th Avenue N. 4) City of St. Petersburg: construction of a multiuse path along 62nd Avenue S from 22nd Street S to Dr. MLK Jr Street. Staff provided an overview of the proposed changes. Dimitri Karides made a motion to recommend approval of the 2021 Transportation Alternatives Program Priority List to the Forward Pinellas Board. This was seconded by George Thurlow and passed with a unanimous vote.

3) Regional Transportation Priorities: Comprised of representatives from the Pinellas, Hillsborough and Pasco County MPO's, the Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area (TMA) Leadership Group held a workshop to discuss their top priorities for transportation projects in the Tampa Bay Area and it was decided, given the number of unfunded regional priorities, to simply advance the 2020 priorities list to 2021. The West Central Florida MPO Chairs Coordinating Committee (CCC) discussed their regional transportation priority projects at their November 20th meeting as well and also elected to advance their 2020 priorities list to 2021. Staff reviewed the projects on the TMA and CCC priority lists. Gloria Lepik-Corrigan made a motion to recommend approval by the Forward Pinellas Board of the 2021 Regional Transportation Priority Project Lists. This was seconded by Tony Stillo and passed with a unanimous vote.

7. GANDY PROJECT DEVELOPMENT & ENVIRONMENT STUDY KICKOFF

Mr. Craig Fox, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), shared a presentation on the Gandy Boulevard (US-92/SR-600) Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study. The project limits are from 4th Street N. in Pinellas County to S. Westshore Boulevard in Hillsborough County. This study will evaluate roadway capacity improvements and the addition of bicycle and pedestrian facilities within the study limits. The purpose of the study is to reduce traffic congestion and improve bike/ped accommodations in both Hillsborough and Pinellas counties. The improvements being evaluated are roadway widening and reconstruction, bridge replacement over Old Tampa Bay, as well as the construction of a grade separated overpass at Brighton Bay Boulevard. Also being evaluated is a bike/ped shared use path crossing Old Tampa Bay and safe routes crossing Gandy Boulevard. The project will be completed in three segments, segment 1 in Pinellas County, segment 2 including both Gandy Bridges, and segment 3 in Hillsborough County. For segment 1 in Pinellas County, the build alternative is a 4-lane controlled access roadway (2 lanes each direction) with frontage roads for water/maintenance/beach area access and bike/ped accommodations on both side of Gandy Boulevard. For segment 2 including the Gandy Bridge, the project is evaluating widening the existing west bound Gandy Bridge to repurpose it for east bound travel. Segment 2 also includes construction of a new west bound bridge on the north side of the existing bridge and the addition of a multiuse trail linking Pinellas and Hillsborough counties. For segment 3 in Hillsborough, the project will tie in with the Selmon West Extension, improve access to surrounding properties and provide operational improvements for the existing intersections. The project will also improve bike/ped connectivity on both sides of Gandy Boulevard. With regards to the Five-Year Work Program funding, the PD&E is fully funded, and segment 1 design is scheduled for FY 2025. All other aspects are not yet funded or scheduled for funding. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

8. EQUITY ASSESSMENT AND DEMOGRAPHIC SURVEY

Ms. Angela Ryan, Forward Pinellas staff, shared a presentation with the members announcing that Forward Pinellas is conducting an equity assessment of its agency operations and planning activities. The goal is to ensure the Forward Pinellas mission to "provide leadership to align resources and plans that help to achieve a compelling vision for Pinellas County, our individual communities and our region" is both inclusionary and equitable. Forward Pinellas will research systems, policies and practices resulting to determine the inequity in Pinellas County. Using this research, Forward Pinellas will develop

a strategic plan to ensure our work is inclusive and results in equitable outcomes for the entire community. The Equity Assessment will be conducted in three phases: Phase 1-Scoping through conducting interviews, researching best practices and drafting the scope of work. Phase 2- Work Plan through conducting evaluations, identifying opportunities and weaknesses, defining alternatives and recommendations. Phase 3- Implementation through ensuring equity in all policies. The Equity Assessment components will include a high-level timeline for public outreach throughout the process as well as external and internal analysis. BPAC members were asked to assist with the demographic survey by completing the survey with the QR code or link provided. Results from the assessment will be brought back to the committee at a future date. Questions were taken and appropriately answered.

9. OTHER BUSINESS

A. Pinellas SPOTlight Emphasis Areas Update

Regarding US19, the Frontage Road Analysis will be presented to the Forward Pinellas Board in May, with the final recommendations coming later. Regarding the Gateway Area Master Plan, the Gateway Partnership had a meeting March 26th and is working on developing a dashboard template to provide visual information for performance measures to show progress towards Plan implementation. Regarding Enhancing Beach Access, TBARTA has selected a consultant for the Aerial Gondola Project and will begin the next steps in a couple of weeks.

B. TBARTA Update

Bill Jonson reported that at the TBARTA meeting, two presentations were given. One was on a transit survey that is looking at how things were before COVID and what the projections for people are after COVID, comparing the responses to other areas. The second presentation was on the Regional Rapid Transit Project, which was a board request, looking at alternatives and if there are any alternatives that can be implemented sooner in express busing.

Bill Jonson commented at the last meeting, he requested information to be presented on Law Enforcement of DUI's and the next day an article appeared in the paper sharing that three DUI crashes happened at the same time on our roads. As a part of Vision Zero efforts, he requested that Forward Pinellas prioritize this topic for a future meeting.

An update on the RRFB legislation was requested by Tony Stillo. Bill Jonson commented that the Chamber of Commerce was showing a great deal of interest in this legislative action and they are opposed to removing the RRFB's as they do provide a safety measure to pedestrians at street crossings.

New members Kathy Smith, Aron Bryce, Johnny Boykins, Connie Bruce and George Thurlow, took a few minutes to introduce themselves and share their interests with the committee.

THE PLANNING COUNCIL AND METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR PINELLAS COUNTY

The Forward Pinellas Board held this public meeting in person on May 12, 2021 at 1 p.m. in the Magnolia Room at Pinellas County Cooperative Extension. Presenters and members of the public also had the opportunity to participate virtually to ensure public safety in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Please see the following link for more information about virtual meeting policies and procedures.

FDOT District 7 Alex Henry gave a status update on US 19 Frontage Road Study

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) safety action plan for the US 19 (SR 55) frontage roads is focused on the 11.5-mile segment running from north of 49th Street to north of SR 580 (Main Street) through the cities of Pinellas Park, Largo, and Clearwater, as well as unincorporated Pinellas County. Significant redevelopment is planned for this area and the safety action plan will help align transportation strategies with changing land use and development intensity. FDOT presented challenges, needs, preliminary recommendations, and next steps, including a technical analysis and public outreach. FDOT will bring back final recommendations for the board in Fall 2021.

- Commissioner Seel stated that she would like to see a common vision for the treatments along
 the entirety of the frontage roads and agreed that decreasing target speed is needed. However,
 she is hesitant to remove lanes and asked staff their reasoning behind the cost for some of the
 preliminary recommendations.
 - Alex Henry stated that he observed a regular amount people on bicycles and walking around these major intersections and accessing transit. Because the highest cost comes from relocating a curb line and its related impacts on drainage, they were looking at options for sidewalks and on street bike facilities that don't require curbs to be relocated.
- Commissioner Merz also understands slowing down traffic but expressed concern with the removal of a lane, noting that additional congestion could inhibit emergency vehicles if a lane is removed.
- Commissioner Eggers agreed with Commissioner Seel and Commissioner Merz that the best and quickest way to see safety improvements was to lower speeds. He would rather spend more money widening the sidewalk than removing a lane.
- Mayor Buljalski would like to hear from FDOT what solutions would improve traffic, reduce congestion and provide for safety before they think about the cost.
- Whit Blanton was also cautious about reducing lanes but stated this could be one solution in our toolbox for portions of the 11.5-mile corridor. He noted that it will take design changes to

achieve the goal of lowering speeds on the frontage roads to better match the posted speed limit..

The board adopted the Multimodal Transportation Priorities with the addition of the SR580 Duke Energy Trail overpass

The board, acting as the Pinellas County Metropolitan Planning Organization, adopted the Multimodal Priority List for state and federal funding, with the addition of Duke Energy Trail overpass at SR580 to the unfunded priorities list along with similar trail overpasses on the Duke Energy Trail at Gulf-to-Bay Boulevard and Roosevelt Boulevard. The SR 580 trail overpass was originally ranked seventh on the Active Transportation Overpass Priority List. Forward Pinellas staff will review the four planned overpasses ranked #3 through #6 with local agency staff and provide an update to the board in coming months.

Multimodal Priorities

- Commissioner Eggers and Commissioner Seel expressed concern that the SR580 Trail Overpass
 was not on the priority list since other portions of the Pinellas Trail Loop around SR580 were
 already under construction. They primarily sought to keep this project in the forefront of
 everyone's mind during future discussions about our funding priorities.
- Commissioner Long suggested adopting the list now so their current needs are clear, then reassessing once there is a federal roadmap for transportation funding.
- Whit Blanton provided clarification that SR580 Trail Overpass was not included in the staff-recommended priority list because it is seventh on our Active Transportation Plan Overpass technical ranking. He noted that we're trying to be judicious with our limited resources.

However, once the extent of federal funding is clear we can come back and amend this list if needed.

- Chelsea Favero also explained that if an earmark can be secured, or other additional funding, it is easier to advance other projects through the priority list process.
- Mayor Buljalski suggested adding SR580 Trail Overpass to the unfunded projects list, knowing that there is a possibility federal funding could assist in the future. Commissioner Eggers and Commissioner Seel agreed with this recommendation.
- Mr. Blanton stated that adding this project to the unfunded priority list would provide an
 advantage in funding decisions through FDOT. He also noted the current designed trail crossing
 of SR580 will be full traffic signal and that will be safer than most trail crossings today.
- Chair Rice agreed that Mayor Buljalski's recommendation seems reasonable and could also help provide clarity about our priorities when we're looking at future earmarks.
- Councilmember Gabbard noted that SR580 is on the Active Transportation priority list and
 these projects weren't just disappearing if not prioritized today. She expressed concern that
 adding this project would be going against the staff recommendation and cause further
 confusion. In addition, she questioned why we were only adding SR580 and not the other four
 overpass projects that are ranked above that.
- Whit Blanton suggested adding the SR580 Trail Overpass project to the list at this time and directing staff to revisit all the overpass projects to ensure each project is prioritized correctly. In this way he felt assured the other priorities would also be considered.

The board first made a motion to adopt the original priority list as recommended by staff, which did not garner enough votes.

The next motion by the board, to adopt the Multimodal Priority List with the addition of the SR 580 Trail Overpass project to unfunded projects list, passed 12-1 with Councilmember Gabbard dissenting.

The board unanimously adopted the Transportation Alternatives Priorities and Regional Transportation Priorities

The board, acting as the Pinellas County Metropolitan Planning Organization, adopted the annual Transportation Alternatives Program Priority List and the Regional Transportation Priorities.

- Central Ave from 34th St to 31st St (design only)

The board unanimously approved modifications to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The board approved the following modifications to the TIP, adjusting the amount of funds for 2021-2024 (FY) to match the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP):

- FY 2022 Federal Highway Planning (PL) funds are being adjusted from \$997,948 to \$1,107,369
- > FY 2022 Federal Highway Planning (SU) funds are being adjusted from \$500,000 to \$666,047
- Mayor Buljalski clarified with staff that the extra funds are for planning, not capital projects.

The board approved one amendment to the Countywide Plan Map

- The board approved one amendment:
 - An amendment from the City of St. Petersburg to amend the property at 6021 142nd
 Avenue North from Public/Semi-Public and Residential Low Medium to Residential
 Medium and Residential Low Medium to allow for a multifamily residential
 development (13-0)
- Derek Kilborn, City of St. Petersburg Manager for the Urban Planning and Preservation Division, agreed with staff's recommendation for approval, and noted that there were legal challenges to the City's approval in the fall of 2020 that were overturned in favor of the city in April 2021.

- Commissioner Eggers clarified that the height restrictions for the property were appropriate for the area.
- Sean Wilson, President of Blue Sky Communities, also agreed with the staff recommendation. He also provided insight into the preliminary site plan (not yet approved by the City) indicating the building would be four stories and designed to integrate into the surrounding uses.
- Don Mastry, a lawyer for Trenum Law who worked with the church located on the property and Blue Sky Communities, agreed with staff recommendations. He provided more information about the buffering on all sides and details on the previous lawsuit.
- Chair Rice gave insight into her vote to approve this proposal when it came before the City of St. Petersburg, stating that she not only used the city's affordable housing criteria to evaluate this project, but also spent time at the site ensuring she had considered all viewpoints.
- Councilmember Gabbard also stated that the City of St. Petersburg heard concerns about crime, congestion, and if there would be a decrease in property values and felt they had been adequately addressed.
- Commissioner Smith clarified with city staff that traffic analyses had been conducted finding sufficient levels of service.
- Commissioner Long clarified with Forward Pinellas staff that there is no impact to the portion of property that is in a Coastal High Hazard Area because it is not increasing in density.
- Commissioner Gerrard clarified with Blue Sky Communities that they are proposing a total of 85 units in their preliminary site plan.

SPOTlight Update

- Forward Pinellas is planning a fall workshop for the US 19 North Innovative Intersections study.
 Before the workshop, staff will reach out to the community to get a sense of their values, concerns and priorities. After the workshop, Forward Pinellas will go back out to the public focusing on possible recommendations.
- Forward Pinellas is reaching out to several local governments to request a commitment for a local match to get the Clearwater Ferry back to regular services. The future integration of PSTA will make this a more seamless service, and a local commitment for operations will help attract funding from other non-local sources.
- FDOT confirmed with staff that the 34th St. South complete street project will include consistent speeds of 40 mph, with a commitment to re-evaluate for a possibly lower speed limit after the resurfacing project soon to begin is completed.
- Forward Pinellas is looking at an investment corridor planning effort as part of the FY22 budget as this was the cornerstone of our Long Range Transportation Plan.

Updates

- Brad Miller, PSTA CEO, presented updates on active PSTA projects including the completion of the SunRunner construction on the west end of the line, the launch of the 2nd AVA autonomous vehicle pilot program in Dunedin, the addition of four electric buses and one electric Jolley Trolley as well as the expansion of services for the Jolley Trolley, the bus on shoulder pilot project, the Clearwater Multimodal Center, and the upcoming full-service Ferry transit. In addition, PSTA will begin regular services this summer and will begin using the Flamingo Fares mobile app.
- The board expressed consensus for the Legislative Committee to hold a workshop in August focusing on proactive measures to work with legislative delegation in the future.
- Whit Blanton and Commissioner Smith presented updates from the last MPOAC Meeting in April, including possible new federal funding as well as the impacts of electric vehicles on gas taxes and possible solutions.

Other Items

- The board unanimously approved a modification to the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan to include more complete documentation of its cost feasibility in response to the federal certification review that occurred in January. No changes are being made to project costs or revenues.
- The board authorized advertising for public hearings to consider several changes to the Countywide Rules including a Senior Housing Bonus, Map Adjustments and other minor amendments.
- The board approved Forward Pinellas to send a letter of support for a call to reform of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as part of the comment period on the Notice of Proposed Amendments. The goal is to include more multimodal and safe streets concepts.
- Austin Britt, University of South Florida intern, presented the Forward Pinellas Educational Project entitled "City by Design." This educational curriculum is designed to spur student interest in urban, regional and community planning. Staff is working with Pinellas County Schools to implement this hands-on, student-centered learning module into high school and middle school classrooms.
- The Gulf Coast Safe Streets Summit and Bike/Walk Tampa Bay Summit are set for November 2-5th, 2021. See more information at www.gulfcoastsafestreetssummit.org or follow us on social media for the latest updates.



SUMMARY

Forward Pinellas is required to adopt a fiscal year (FY) 2021/22 – FY 2025/26 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) by July 1, 2021 for the county to receive state and federal funding for transportation projects. The TIP contains project descriptions, schedules, and corresponding funding allocations regarding scheduled transportation improvement projects for the 25 local governments of Pinellas County, the Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA), local airports, and the Port of St. Petersburg. The projects include new construction, reconstruction, capital purchases, and maintenance work associated with roads, sidewalks, trails, transit services, airports, the Port of St. Petersburg, and the Transportation Disadvantaged Program. Projects included in the TIP for state and federal funding must be in the adopted Long-Range Transportation Plan.

The annual TIP adoption process involves incorporating the attached Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) FY 2021/22 – FY 2025/26 Final Tentative Work Program into the TIP. The FDOT Work Program includes a five-year schedule of state and federally funded transportation projects, including new projects introduced in the fifth year (2024/2025). At its January 13, 2021 meeting, the Forward Pinellas Board approved the draft version of this document.





6. Wrong Way Drivers



SUMMARY

7. 5th Avenue North Lane Repurposing


