A: Multimodal Priority List



Multimodal Priority List

- Review and adopt annually
- 'Off the top' priorities ranked highest
 - New projects added to the bottom of the list, unless they are considered an annual 'off the top' commitment, like Complete Streets
- Projects remain on the list until completed
 - Two-tiered priority list: funded versus unfunded projects








Removed from the Priority List

- Regional Farebox (Completed)
- Alt US 19 from Belleair Rd to Pasco Co Line
- Alt US 19 from Park St to Belleair Rd
 - Placeholders until corridor study was completed
 - Staff is working with City staff to ID specific projects to add to list
- Aerial Transit Feasibility and Operations Plan
 - Underway through TBARTA

Currently under construction


Drew Street Operational and Safety

Un-Funded

- I-275 from 54th Ave S to Roosevelt Blvd
 - Lane Continuity Improvements
 - Express Lanes from I-375 to Gandy
 - Funding removed from the Work
 Program; added back to prioritized list of projects





New Project Priorities

- St. Pete 22nd St. Complete Streets
 - Annual complete streets priority project
- Call for Projects Applications
 - TBARTA Vanpool Expansion
 - 'Regional Transit' identified as an 'off the top' priority in Advantage Pinellas
 - Cross Bay Ferry Capital Funding
 - 'High' score in competitive process
 - MLK S Improvements from 30th Ave S to 7th Ave S
 - 'Medium-High' score in competitive process









New Project Priorities

Active Transportation Plan (ATP) Priorities

- Identified through technical scoring developed with County and municipal staff, and approved by the Forward Pinellas Board
- Includes both multiuse trails and overpasses
- Committed to advancing incrementally onto the priority list
- #1 priorities from the ATP added in 2020 and are already moving forward
- 28th Street Trail
 - 30th Ave N to Roosevelt Blvd
 - Multiuse Trail and bicycle boulevard combo
- Duke Energy Overpass at Roosevelt/Carillon
 - High number of daily vehicles
 - Large crossing distance for bicyclists and pedestrians
 - Strong equity considerations







New Project Priorities

- Integrated Waterborne
 Transportation System Phase I
 - North county intercoastal operations
 - Complimentary to existing private sector ferry service
 - Dock construction
 - Vessel acquisition
 - Partnership between PSTA and private sector operator

B: Transportation Alternatives Priorities



Eligible Projects

- Pedestrian and bicycle projects
- Infrastructure to improve non-driver access to transit service





List Updates

- Removal of 7 completed projects
- 28th St. from Pinellas Trail to 1st Ave N
 - Fully funded
- Central Ave from 34th to 31st St
 - Design funded





Adding New Projects

- Call for Projects Summer 2020
- Minimum Award: \$300k
- Max Award: \$2 million
- 2 submittals per jurisdiction
- After 3 years, projects will be removed from the list if not completed

Prerequisites:

- Local Commitment
- 100% of ROW or easement
- LAP Certification



Ranking of New Projects

- 1. 118th Ave in Pinellas Park 65 points
- 2. 28th St. in St. Petersburg 65 points
- 3. 46th St. N in Lealman 60 points
- 4. 62nd Ave S in St. Petersburg 60 points
- Total possible points: 75
- Recommend these top 4 projects be added to the bottom of the priority list, in this order
- Approved by committees and board in January




C: Regional Priority Lists



Why Regional Transportation Planning?

- Tampa Bay is a fast-growing region; travelers and shippers do not consider county boundaries
- Provide a clear message on regional transportation needs & priorities
- Improve inter-agency coordination
- Provide context for local decisionmaking
- Resolve intra-regional transportation conflicts









History of Regional Planning

- CCC formed in 1993 by Legislature
 - Sarasota-Manatee added in 2000
 - Citrus added in 2011
- 2014 TMA LG formed ad-hoc to focus on Pasco, Pinellas, Hillsborough urbanized area
- 2020 TMA established as a subcommittee to the CCC





CCC Structure

- Board members are elected officials (MPO chairs)
- Partner Entities serve in non-voting capacity
- Staffing provided by member MPOs
- TMA Leadership Group to serve as a subcommittee





TMA Priorities

- I-275 Express Lanes from I-375 to Gandy Blvd.
- I-275 Operational Improvements north of downtown Tampa
- I-75 Interchange at Gibsonton
- Regional Rapid Transit in the I-275 Corridor
- Support HART's exploration and negotiation for use of the CSX right-of-way for passenger transportation







CCC Priorities


- I-275 Express Lanes from I-375 to Gandy Blvd.
- I-275 improvements north of Downtown Tampa (I-4 to Bearss Ave)
- I-75 Interchange at Gibsonton Dr
- Regional Rapid Transit in the I-275 Corridor
- Support HART's exploration and negotiation for use of the CSX right-of-way for passenger transportation
- Central Polk Parkway Segment 1
- US 41 from SR 44 to SR 200
- Desoto Bridge Replacement
- Bradenton-Palmetto Connector
- CR 557 from US 17/92 to I-4
